

Bound to Oahu (Sandwich Is.)

Tuesday Sept 19th 1843

Commenced with Squalls and rainy weather. Wind from S. steering E. by Compass Middle and after part Moderate breeze from S. E. steering Full and by with all sail set sent down the Mizzen and sent up the Spunker

Wednesday Sept 20th 1843

This day commences with Moderate breezes from S. E. by S. steering on the Wind to the Eastward. After part Moderate breeze from S by W. steering on the wind to the E. N. E.

Thursday Sept 21st 43

All these 24 hours fine weather and moderate breezes from S. S. W. steering on the wind. Water empty and everything sail &c.

Friday Sept 22nd 1843

Commences with Light winds from S. S. W. at 4 P.M. raised a fair on our weather. After part Moderate winds from S. W. steering East. 2 sails in sight.

Bound to the Eastward

Saturday Sept 23rd 43

Commenced with Moderate winds from S. W. steering East at 5 P.M. spoke the "Susan of Nantucket" (Capt Russell. The other said is the "Fred Mitchell" of Nantucket. The Susan was struck just before morning. Lost main top mast, 1st Green and Royal mast. No lives lost. The C. M. was close by and lent them assistance. Capt. P. then went on board and spent the evening. After part Moderate breeze from S. by W. steering East.

Sunday Sept 24th 43

Commenced with Moderate winds from S. by W. steering East by Compass. At 8 P.M. spoke the "Susan" again and we promised to go on board to morning and get 2 casks of Water. C. M. on our Weather Bow steering East. After part Moderate breeze from S. by E. at 8 went on board of the S. and got 2 casks of Water.

Monday Sept 25th 1843

All these 24 hours strong breezes from S. E. by S. steering on the wind. With all sail set. 3 sails in sight on our lee Bow
