Tuesday February 25<sup>th</sup>  
Throughout this 24 hours fine weather at 6 P.M.  
took our anchor for the 5<sup>th</sup> time and headed  
out of the harbor and made sail steering by  
the wind to the S.W. left the James Stewart  
in the harbor

Monday February 26<sup>th</sup>  
Throughout these 24 hours fresh breeze and squally  
with rain saw one sail in sight of the land

Tuesday February 27<sup>th</sup>  
At this 24 hours strong breeze from the  
N.E. under double reefed topsails in sight of  
the land bearing S.W. distance 30 miles

Wednesday February 28<sup>th</sup>  
Open. Throughout this 24 hours strong breeze  
from the N.E. steering by the wind  
on both tacks keeping in with the land

Thursday February 29<sup>th</sup>  
Throughout this 24 hours more excellent steering  
by the wind to the S.W. and N.W. at 11. And  
I had on shore some of at 1.50. 11

Friday February 1<sup>st</sup>  
Throughout these 24 hours fine weather at 11  
sight the boat on shore at 9 P.M. came on  
board and kept off S.W. fine weather  
steering along with the land

Saturday March 2<sup>nd</sup>  
At this 24 hours fine weather ship steering  
N.W. by W. the land in sight bearing S.W.

Sunday March 3<sup>rd</sup>  
Commenced with strong breeze from the N.E.  
steering N.W. by W. by compass under all sail  
middle and later part much the same  
Lat by the 4.15. 11

Monday March 4<sup>th</sup>  
Came in with strong breeze from the N.E.  
steering N.W. by W. under all sail  
then we are in feeling to ground. And want  
to see you can take 60 hundred and fifty fine  
prospects for. A young man (I am sure  
I think) I shall be able to sell 10 pounds  
Doubtless I shall off this but thank the Lord  
it will not be long. I expect we shall have  
how our fingers before long so look with fine  
weather fair weather in the whole line

Came in with strong breeze from N.E.
