

Monday June 3
First part of this day comes in clear with light

to the Northward At 6 A.M. saw whales and found
lead struck the whale near to the windward. Lead
had to get account of it. A thick snow storm
came on fogged and shortened sail for the night
At 5 P.M. more clear saw one whale shot to the
ship and found but to no purpose. To Cook's watch
Long day but no whale kill. Lat by Obs 49.20 N
Long by Obs 154. E

Tuesday June 4
Throughout this day thick fog light air from
the Northward and Eastward being too much. A host
of rain to sail and found At 4 P.M. saw
the whale could not see for the fog. To Cook's
watch

Wednesday June 5
Throughout this day strong breeze from the
N.W. & lying fair weather short sail in a
thick fog. Plenty of whales but cannot
see for them. Account of the fog. To Cook's
watch

Thursday June 6
Throughout this day strong gales from the
Northward lying fair weather to the Eastward
plenty of whales in sight but cannot see
them in the low boat. To Cook's watch

Friday June 7
Comes in with fair weather steering to
the Northward under easy sail At 11 A.M.
saw whales found struck two ice parted
and the other got from in a thick
fog

Saturday June 8
Throughout this day strong breeze from the
Eastward with a thick fog steering
to the Northward for good weather
Whales blowing all around but cannot
see for the fog. To Cook's watch
short sail

Sunday June 9
Throughout this day light breeze from the S.E. steering
by the wind to the southward. In company with ship
Maxat of Brimian 19 months out 300 lbs taken
to Whales this season which made 1100 lbs. At 2
P.M. saw whales found and struck killed the
whale taking one lead and two ice & came on
board were taken to Cook's watch. Sabbath day

Monday June 10
First part of this day comes in with calm
and foggy ship went in sight. Lying Captain
Ward went on board caught 5 hundred fathoms
of twine. Came on board and saw ship
to the Northward At 4 P.M. saw whales found in
sight to the westward. Later part found one
boat in chase of it. Cook's watch
Lead foggy Lat by Obs 51.50 N

Tuesday June 11
Throughout this day light breeze from the Eastward
Lead breeze At 4 P.M. saw whales found
found the west part struck the starboard
boat killed took him. Tongue and commenced
cutting up the whale to make one hundred
lbs. of blubber. At 5 P.M. Cook's watch
saw for the night the Maxat in sight. To Cook's
watch

Wednesday June 12
Comes in with foggy weather At 4 P.M. finished
cutting commenced trying out the water
plenty of whales in sight and foggy. To Cook's
watch

Thursday June 13
First part of this day comes in with foggy weather
light breeze from the Eastward steering
by the wind. Later part more clear saw whales
found found but to no purpose. To Cook's
watch
