strong breeze and clear breeze to the Southward
under double reef topsails. We have seen three
sun this last part of the day and I hope
by the next month of July I shall be where
I can see it All day and my articles finished
so Ends Let boy (No 5) 20.11

Friday July 5th
Throughout this day fine weather Light Air
from the Westward At 10 A.M. made Baringes
Island having off N. off by Compass Stead
in At 12 M. hauled on the vessel to clear the
Land the watch employed stowing down the rest
of this day 2.5.11 so Ends the land please
in sight and plenty of snow

Long boy (No 16) 2.3.11

Saturday July 6th
Comes in with Light Air from S. off steering N. off
At 11 A.M. saw two sails At 12 M. hauled up with
three dead spears three both by the Trident of
Kewledford 12 Months but 1/2 the latter 10 months
At 11 M. hauled later part strong breeze and rainy
steering N. off in company with the trident
heard from the Land 15 whales four follows
plenty humpbacks so Ends weather Long Day
"Trident"

Sunday July 7th
Commences with Light Air from the Northward strong
foggy trident in company At 10 A.M. saw the main
Land of St. Hansa the sailing off N. off stood in
At 12 M. hauled of 3 off saw two ships At 5 P.M.
came up with them one the James Steward of Santiago
two whales this season the latter high day of St. Hansa
one whale this season four follows and began to look
up in the world the whales has all struck off
No. we can see is humpbacks finbacks and whales
going all ways but some whales wait later part
clear and pleasant so Ends gunning N. off

Monday July 8th
Commences with Light Air from the Northward
foggy steering S. N. off by Compass in company
with the James Steward Middle part more clear
saw five ships steering all ways looking for whales
later part part wind hauled to Southward the Captain
I believe is Agate make it fair wind of it
Let it blow which way it will the then rain
steering N. off At 5 P.M. the Captain went
on board of the James Steward to take tea
in N thick fog I hope he will get gunning
through this season the confunder employed mending
the boat the Cooper working river so Ends
Let boy (No 5) 11.11

Southward and Westward steering to the
Northward and East in company with
the James Steward heavy weather gunning
so Ends weather Long day
