

Bark *Volga* Towards, Juan Feb 1851

Remarks on Sunday Feb the 9th
These 24 hours fresh trades and fine weather
first part steering S.W. latter part steering
W by S. so ends this day Lat 5° 08' Long 168° 58'

Monday the 10th
These 24 hours hailing winds with rain
squalls steering West so ends Lat 5° 02'
Long 166° 31'

Tuesday Feb the 11th
These 24 hours fresh trades and fine weather
first part steering W. latter part steering W by S
Lat 5° 09' Long 164° 55'

Remarks on Wednesday the 12th
These 24 hours strong trades and squally
weather ship laying off and on at Strong's
Island situated in the Lat 5° 12' N Long 162° 58' E

Remarks on Thursday the 13th
First part of these 24 hours laying off and on
at Strong's Island in hopes the natives
would come off to trade but none came off
at meridian hauled off shore steering at
3 P.M. changed the course to N.W. by W. so ends

Remarks on Friday the 14th
These 24 hours strong trades first part
steering N.W. by W. latter part steering N.W.
saw an Island in the forenoon and 2 in
the afternoon so ends Lat 6° 35'
Long 160° 54'

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Remarks on Saturday Feb the 15th 1851
These 24 hours strong trades and fine weather
steering N.W. by W. took in the top gallant sails
Lat 7° 12' Long 158° 22' E

Remarks on Sunday the 16th
These 24 hours strong trades and fine weather
steering N.W. by W. so ends this day Lat 8° 57'
Long 155° 57'

Remarks on Monday the 17th
These 24 hours strong trades and fine weather
first and middle parts steering N.W. by W. latter
part steering N.W. by W. so ends this day Lat 10° 08'
Long 153° 44'

Remarks on Tuesday Feb the 18th
These 24 hours begin with strong trades
steering S.W. by W. middle and latter parts
light trades latter part steering N.W.

Remarks on Wednesday Feb the 19th
These 24 hours strong trades and fine weather
steering N.W. by W. latter part steering N.W. by W.
Lat 13° 36' Long 149° 04'

Remarks on Thursday the 20th
These 24 hours strong trades and fine weather first
and middle parts steering N.W. by W. at meridian changed
the course to W by S at 1 P.M. saw the Island Laysan
bearing W by S at 4 P.M. kept away to the S.W. at
sundown luffed to the wind and shortened sail
heading N by W the nearest land bearing S.E. distant
6 miles
Lat 15° 17' Long 146° 40'
