Remarks on Thursday March the 20th
These 24 hours light trades and fine weather
at 9 A.M. put the ship under weigh for the
Port of Wometo to get water arrived at said Port
at meridian anchored in 14 fathoms of water
latter part took on board 30 Bbls of water

Remarks on Friday March the 21st
This day all hands employed in taking
in water

Remarks on Saturday the 22nd
This day light trades and fine weather all
hands employed in watering ship at 4 P.M.
finished at 8 got under weigh and stood off
on the Northern tack saw a ship go in
to Wometo directly after we came out

Remarks on Sunday the 23rd
At 3 P.M. the Capt. went ashore at Santa Cruz
ship laying off and on

Remarks on Monday the 24th
These 24 hours ship laying off and on
the Capt ashore

Remarks on Tuesday the 25th
These 24 hours the same as yesterday

These 24 hours the same as yesterday
