Remarks on Monday the 23^d June 1851

First part of these 24 hours calm middle and latter parts light winds from the Southward and overcast steering at the watch employed in scraping bone and stowing it away. Saw one sail. Lat 62.02 Lon 176.00

Remarks on Tuesday the 24th

These 24 hours began with light winds from the Southward steering S.W. Fine weather in the fore noon steering W. by N. under all sail saw 2 ships at 1 P.M. saw ice to the N. hauled up S.W. by W. at 3 P.M. shut in thick fog. Lat 61.12 Long 173.50

Remarks on Wednesday the 25th

The most of these 24 hours foggy the wind from the Southward saw one whale chased him without success spoke the Ship Mainava Smyth of New Bedford. Lat 63.00 Lon 180.00

Remarks on Thursday the 26th

These 24 hours fresh breezes from S.W. to W. by W. and fine weather saw the land and saw several wild whales all going to the windward quick saw several ships chasing whales. Lat 63.00 Lon 176.55

Remarks on Friday June 27th

First part of these 24 hours light air and fine weather land in sight the ship heading for it saw one whale towed for him and have not seen him since latter part saw a ship cutting a whale saw ice. Lat 63.26

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Remarks on Saturday the 28th

These 24 hours pleasant weather the land about ten miles distant and ice from that to the shore saw several wild whales chased nearly all day without success

Remarks on Sunday the 29th

These 24 hours light variable winds and good weather land and ice in sight and a few whales wild as ever spoke the Ship Philip Delano of Fairhaven 3 years out with 750 Bbls sp oil and 250 Polar. Lat 63.21

Remarks on Monday the 30th

These 24 hours fine weather cruising off Cape Chadeu. Lat 63.16

Remarks on Tuesday July the 1st

These 24 hours strong gales from the North saw humps of ice as large as a ship's hull Cape Chadeu bearing S.W. 20 miles distant. Lat 63.13

Remarks on Wednesday the 2^d

These 24 hours light winds from the S.W. and thick fogs

Remarks on Thursday the 3^d

These 24 hours foggy first part light air from the N.E. latter part calm saw 3 whales towed without success as usual
