

Off Pt. Lawrence Island Aug. 1951

Remarks on Monday the 25th
First part a gale from the N. latter part light
winds and thick weather saw one whale

Remarks on Tuesday the 26th
These 24 hours light winds from the N
and tolerable good weather repaired
the main & sail

Remarks on Wednesday the 27th
First part strong breeze from the N middle
part light airs from the N. W. and fine
weather saw 5 ships and one whale
saw the main land and Pt. Lawrence
Island latter part calm a current
setting to the Southward Lat 63.13

Remarks on Thursday the 28th
First part light winds from the S. W.
steering in for Pt. Lawrence Island at 5 A.M.
saw whales lowered for them without success
at 10 A.M. 3 boats went in to the wreck of the
Acushnet to get an anchor at 4 P.M. returned
with it the dist of 4 miles at 5 P.M. anchored
the ship and the boats went in after oil
latter part calm at 11 P.M. got to the ship with
21 cask of oil

Remarks on Friday the 29th
First part a light breeze from the Eastward at 7
A.M. got the ship under weigh and stood off shore
middle and latter parts a gale from the Northward

Sept 30th

Remarks on Saturday the 30th
These 24 hours light winds from the
N. E. and thick weather saw the main land
spoke the ship Mount Vernon of New Bedford
with 2 whales this season

Remarks on Sunday Aug the 31st
First part a fresh breeze from the Northward
latter part light airs from the Southward
the main land in sight and Pt. Lawrence Island

Remarks on Monday Sept the 1st
These 24 hours a strong breeze from the
Southward beating up to the wreck
at 6 P.M. anchored in 12 fathoms of water
about 5 miles from the wreck

Remarks on Tuesday the 2^d
These 24 hours light winds from the S. W.
and fine weather took on board 34 casks of
oil from the wreck and stowed it down

Remarks on Wednesday the 3^d
First part light winds from the Eastward
at 7 A.M. got the ship under weigh and took
our departure from Pt. Lawrence Island
and the old Acushnet
