Remarks on Thursday the 4<sup>th</sup>  
These 24 hours a fine breeze from the  
N.E. and fine weather steering N.W.  
Lat 63.02  
Lon 178.28 Chron  
West

Remarks on Friday the 5<sup>th</sup>  
First part a fresh breeze from the N.E. steering  
N.W. middle part light winds from the N.W.  
latter part calm at meridian the main land  
in sight from W. to N.W. about 20 miles distant  
Lat 62.15  
Lon 177.13 E by Chron

Remarks on Saturday the 6<sup>th</sup>  
These 24 hours light air from the Southward  
and fine weather saw one right whale

Remarks on Sunday the 7<sup>th</sup>  
These 24 hours light airs and calms  
and fine weather caught a Seal  
saw a right whale last night Lat 61.16

Remarks on Monday the 8<sup>th</sup>  
These 24 hours a strong breeze from  
the S.E. steering S.W. set the  
Hesperus standing sail for the first time  
Lat 60.44

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Remarks on Tuesday the 9<sup>th</sup>  
These 24 hours light winds from  
the N.E. and fine weather steering  
S.W. so ends this day Lat 58.53

Remarks on Wednesday the 10<sup>th</sup>  
This day about the same as yesterday  
Lat 57.57

Remarks on Thursday the 11<sup>th</sup>  
These 24 hours a strong breeze from the N.W.  
First part steering S.W. latter part steering N.W.  
Lat 56.34  
by Chronometer Lon 172.27 E

Remarks on Friday the 12<sup>th</sup>  
These 24 hours light winds from the  
westward Lat 55.59  
Lon 168.25 E

Remarks on Saturday the 13<sup>th</sup>  
These 24 hours light air from the N.W.  
Lat 55.27

Remarks on Sunday the 14<sup>th</sup>  
These 24 hours light winds from N.E. steering  
S.W. at 6 P.M. saw Copper Island bearing  
N.W. 20 miles dist Lat 55.20
