

Towards the Sandwich Islands Sept. 1851

Remarks on Monday the 15th
First part fresh breeze from the Northward
and squally thick weather at 4 A.M. saw
Copper Island bearing N.W. at 9 A.M. saw
Bhearings Island bearing W. steered various
courses from W to N.E. & passed between the
two Islands at meridian Lat 54° 58'
Lon 167° 45'

Remarks on Tuesday the 16th
These 24 hours light variable winds steering
N.W. & saw 2 ships Lat 54° 17'
Lon 167° 42'

Remarks on Wednesday the 17th
These 24 hours light winds from the
Westward first part steering N.W. & E
latter part steering N.W. & 2 ships in sight
Lat 52° 50' Lon 167° 50'

Remarks on Thursday the 18th
First part of these 24 hours light winds
from the Westward and fine weather
steering N.W. & employed in repairing a
top sail & ships in sight at 4 P.M.
the wind changed to the North a strong
breeze with some rain Lat 50° 18'
Lon 168° 03' East

Remarks on Friday the 19th
These 24 hours a strong breeze from
the N.W. steering N.E. & carried away St. B. Gallant
yard splined it and sent it aloft again

Lon 170° 16' E

Bark Polya Towards the Sandwich Islands
Sept. 1851

Remarks on Saturday the 20th
First part light winds from the Westward
and overcast steering N.W. & latter part
a fresh breeze from the Southward
steering E by N Lat 47° 20'
Lon 173° 16' East

Remarks on Sunday the 21st
These 24 hours a strong breeze from the
Westward steering E by N Lat 46° 35'
Lon 176° 02' East

Remarks on Monday the 22^d
These 24 hours a fresh breeze from
the Westward first part steering E by N
latter part steering East Lat 45° 33' Lon 179° 16' East

Remarks on Tuesday the 23^d
These 24 hours light winds from the Westward
steering East employed in repairing
a M. sail one ship in sight so ends this day
Lat 44° 58' Lon 179° 32' West

Remarks on Wednesday the 24th
These 24 hours a fresh breeze from
the Eastward and fine weather
ships heading N.E. Lat 45° 07'
Lon 176° 51' W
