

Remarks on board Bark Geomine Cruising for Sperma

Monday Nov 24th 1845 First part of this day comes in with moderate breezes from the N.E. heading by the wind S.E. saw breaches middle part squally latter part the same at sunrise but a new main top sail so ends this day Lat 19° 18' Long 36° 02'

Tuesday Nov 25th 1845 First part of this day comes in with moderate breezes from the N.E. heading by the wind S.W. at sundown shortened sail middle fine latter part strong breezes employed in reefing sails so ends this day Lat 18° 30' Long 36° 53'

Wednesday Nov 26th 1845 This day comes in with strong breeze from N.E. heading by the wind N.W. saw several sail at sundown shortened sail as usual middle part the same latter part saw nothing worth remarking under short sail so ends this day Lat 17° 57' Long 37° 17' N

Thursday Nov 27th 1845 First part of this day comes in with moderate breezes from the N.E. heading by the wind S.W. saw large breach at 2 PM lashed to the N.W. wind under a part at 7 PM work ship to the S.E. latter part strong breezes so ends this day Lat 17° 58' Long 37° 40' N

Friday Nov 28th 1845 This day comes in with strong breezes from the N.E. heading by the wind S.E. at 6 PM lashed to the N.W. wind shortened sail middle part squally and rainy latter the same saw several sail so ends this day N.E. Obs

Saturday Nov 29th 1845 First part of this day comes in with strong breezes from the N.E. heading by the wind S.E. middle part rainy and squally middle part same latter part at 11 AM spoke a Japan of Amsterdam 60 days out clear last went on board and got some papers so ends this day Lat 18° 30' Long 37° 40' N

Whales in South Atlantic Ocean John Gooding Master

Sunday Nov 30th 1845 This day comes in with strong breezes from the N.E. at 2 PM kept off for 3 PM lashed to the N.W. wind middle part rainy latter part the same with calms so ends this day N.E. Obs

Monday Dec 1st 1845 This day comes in with light winds from the S heading by the wind S.W. and rainy saw two sail at sundown fine wind S.W. heading S.E. latter part the same at 11 AM saw two Pinbacks so ends this day Lat 21° 07' Long 37° 22' N

Tuesday Dec 2nd 1845 This day comes in with moderate breezes from the S heading by the wind S.E. at sundown lashed ship to the N.W. middle part the same latter part same from the S heading N.W. so ends this day Lat 21° 09' Long 38° 56' N

Wednesday Dec 3rd 1845 First part of this day comes in with moderate breezes from the S heading by the wind N.W. middle part wind very light latter part wind from the N.E. storm S.W. saw nothing so ends this day Lat 21° 28' Long 40° 10' N

Thursday Dec 4th 1845 First part of this day comes in with light winds from the N.E. steering S.W. by N employed in rigging ship duty latter part fine wind from the S steering N.W. at 9 AM made Cape Rio heading N.W. at 11 AM distance 20 miles so ends this day Lat 23° 17' Long 41° 33' N

Friday Dec 5th 1845 First part of this day comes in with moderate breezes from the N.E. steering N.W. middle part fine latter part the same wind variable at 9 AM passed a Thermopside Bay had lost her pregnant at 11 AM loaded the American Bark Neptune and got some papers so ends this day
