

Remains on board Brig Jeannet cruising for

Monday Jan 5th 1846 First part of this day comes in with moderate gales from the N. steering course S at 4 P.M. took in all sail but spencers and close reefed fore and main topsails and hauled to the wing for raining hard middle part more moderate latter part the same set double reefed topsails and courses and were ship to the S.W. wind morning so ends this day Lat 34° 48' S Long 46° 45' W

Tuesday Jan 6th 1846 First part of this day comes in with moderate gales laying to under double reefed topsails heading S at 1 P.M. furled the fore topsail with close reefed the main middle part the same latter part more moderate so ends this day Lat 34° 48' S Long 46° 45' W

Wednesday Jan 7th 1846 First part of this day comes in with strong breezes from the N. and a very heavy swell heading S at 2 P.M. set fore sail and hauled to the wing for wind hauled to the S.W. were ship to the N.W. middle part fine latter part the same at 4 P.M. light made all sail heading by the wind S at 1 P.M. made a sail so ends this day in company in repairing sails Lat 34° 48' S Long 46° 45' W

Thursday Jan 8th 1846 First part of this day comes in with moderate breezes from the N. heading S at 4 P.M. saw Grampuses at 4 P.M. hauled to the wing for steering S.W. middle part the same latter part strong breezes from the N. heading S at 1 P.M. so ends this day Lat 35° 46' S Long 46° 52' W

Friday Jan 9th 1846 First part of this day comes in with strong breezes from the N. heading S at 4 P.M. took in main topsail and double reefed the topsails at sundown close reefed the main and took in the courses and set double reefed topsails moderate latter part the same wind from S.W. heading N.W. saw several pieces of sperm so ends this day Lat 36° 56' S Long 47° 30' W

Friday Jan 10th This day comes in with fine pleasant weather wind from the S heading N.W. at 1 P.M. lashed ship to the E.S.E. at sundown shortened sail and were ship to the S.W. wind from S heading N.W. part fine latter part employed in repairing topsail so ends this day steering S.W. Lat 37° 43' S Long 47° 44' W

Saturday Jan 11th Commenced moderate breezes from the N.W. steering course S.W. under all sail saw Grampuses at sundown to the middle part the same latter part squally and rainy accompanied with thunder and lightning so ends this day Lat 38° 15' S Long 48° 45' W

Sunday Jan 12th comes in with squally rainy weather wind from the N.W. heading S.W. had 11 P.M. thunder and lightning saw nothing except a piece of whale middle part the same latter part saw Grampuses so ends this day raining hard Lat 38° 15' S Long 48° 45' W

Monday Jan 13th Commenced moderate breezes from the N.W. steering course S.W. at 4 P.M. wind hauled to the E.S.E. heading to the wind I saw abundance of birds middle part strong breezes from the N. heading S.S.E. latter part the same at 8 P.M. lashed ship to the E.S.E. so ends this day Lat 38° 53' S Long 49° 30' W

Tuesday Jan 14th This day comes in with strong breezes from the N. heading by the wind over the under double reefed topsails and courses middle part the same latter part at 8 P.M. spoke Brig Jeannet of Mattapoisett 12 months out 800 lbs sperm kept barrel on board and got some papers at 9 P.M. Capt. went back again and we kept her off in company so ends Lat 38° 53' S Long 49° 30' W

Wednesday Jan 15th This day comes in with strong breezes from the N. heading course S in company with Brig Jeannet at sundown hauled to the wind and shortened sail middle part moderate gales laying to under double reefed topsails latter part the same at 10 P.M. saw large sperm whale but did not lower for him it being too rugged at 11 P.M. took in fore and main topsails so ends this day heading N.W. Lat 40° 06' S Long 49° 24' W
