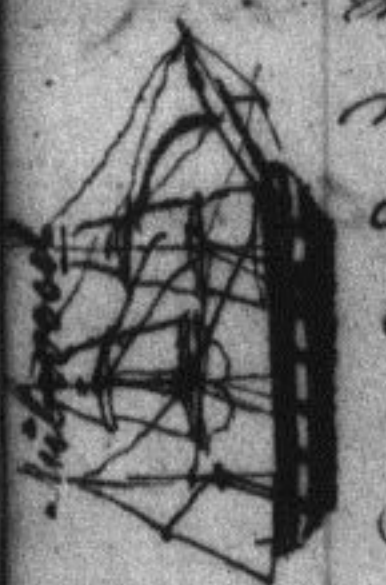


Remarks on Board Bark Yeoman Sperm Whaling

1846 Friday April 3^d commences strong breeze and very
rugged at 1 P.M. parted fluke chain again and had to
make all sail to work to windward to catch him
at 4 took him along side again and put the large
cable on him middle part more moderate latter part
the same commenced cutting again at 9 o'clock spoke
Bark Malwood New Bedford 19 months out 1700 lbs 20
sperm got one blubber hook from him so ends 230 lbs



Saturday April 4th comes in with moderate breeze and
a heavy swell & going at 6 P.M. finished cutting both the
at 8 o'clock commenced running middle part the same
part at 4 o'clock commenced boiling at 5 do wind hauled
the S heading S.W. by W so ends this day

Sunday April 5th comes in with moderate breeze from
the S.E. heading S.W. all hands employed in boiling one of
the men got one of his toes cut off by the chimes of a full
cask middle part fine latter part the same saw nothing
worth remarking Lat 35° 25' S Long 50° 41' W



Monday April 6th comes in with strong breeze and fine
pleasant weather all hands employed in boiling at 5 P.M. finished
and washed off the decks middle part equally latter part at
daylight commenced stowing down at 10 o'clock spoke ship
at northeast of New Bedford 19 months out 1900 lbs 80 sperm
so ends this day Lat 38° 41' S Long 50° 10' W

Tuesday April 7th comes in with moderate breeze from
the W.S.W. heading S.W. at 1 P.M. were ship to the S saw
a spout several times at 4 do finished stowing down the
and washed off the decks middle part fine latter part
same so ends this day Lat 39° 12' S Long 49° 52' W

Wednesday April 8th comes in with moderate breeze from
the W.S.W. heading S.W. the watch on deck employed in
ships duty on dottle part equally latter part strong breeze
from the N steering S.W. by S ends this day
in ships duty Lat 39° 17' S Long 50° 01'

Thursday April 9th comes in with strong breeze from
the N steering course W at sundown shortened sail and
hauled to the wind W.N.W. middle part equally and during
latter part the same wind from all quarters of the
compass steering to westward so ends this day 230 lbs

Friday April 10th comes in with strong breeze from the
S steering course W.S.W. made short sail middle part
the same latter part equally and saw nothing worth
remarking so ends this day Lat 38° 33' S Long 49° 28'

Saturday April 11th comes in with strong breeze from the S.W.
heading W under close reefed topsails and spencers saw
one sail stretching to the S.E. middle part equally latter
part at 6 to 10 saw shaft of whaler at 9 do lowered the
and Starboard Boat the waist boat struck and parted line
sprayed the Starboard Boat and struck one at the mast took
him along side so ends this day with strong breeze and very
rugged Lat 38° 20' S Long 48° 30' W

Sunday April 12th comes in with strong breeze from the
W heading S.W. employed in cutting in the whale at
dark stopped cutting for the night middle part fine
latter part the same at 12 A.M. finished cutting
in so ends this day Lat 3

Monday April 13th comes in with strong breeze from the N
employed in boiling the case at 4 P.M. finished and
commenced boiling middle and latter part the same at daylight
made sail heading S.W. by W wind from the N.W. by W
Lat 38° 07' S Long 48° 45' W

Tuesday April 14th comes in with moderate breeze
from the N.W. heading W.S.W. at sundown shortened
sail the watch employed in boiling middle part the same
latter part at daylight made sail heading of wind from the
W.N.W. saw 3 killers so ends this day Lat 39° 12' S Long 48° 15'
