

Remarks Made on Board Bark Yeoman 1847

Tuesday January 12th 1847
Begins with a Light Breeze from the Eastward Steering S by W
Hano still in Light. Broke out one Barrel of Beef middle part
the same saw one finback At 7 A.M. Broke a Barrel of Beef
Latter part of Good Breeze from N.E. So Ends there 24 hours
Lat by obs 13° 06' N.
Long by Chron 25° 00'

Wednesday January 13th 1847
Begins with a Good Breeze from N.E. Steering S by W under
all sail two sails in Light middle part the same Latter
part a Strong Breeze. All hands busied At work saw
porpoises So Ends there 24 hours Lat by obs 10° 26' N.
Long by D.R. 25° 00'

Thursday January 14th 1847
Begins with a Strong Breeze from N.E. Steering Southward
All sail saw several porpoises middle part Strong Breeze from
the Eastward Latter part more moderate with some rain
So Ends there 24 hours Lat by obs 8°
Long by Chron 24°

Friday January 15th 1847
Begins with a Light Breeze from the Eastward. Saw Black
Sailed three Boats without success middle part Squally
and a plenty of rain Latter part more moderate All the
At work saw one finback So Ends there 24 hours Lat 6° 15'

Saturday January 16th 1847
Begins with a Good Breeze from N.E. Steering S.E. Broke out
barrel of Flour middle part a Strong Breeze from the Eastward
Latter part filled a large boat hook and Head Spade one in
in Light So Ends there 24 hours.

Lat by obs 3° 40' N.
Long by Chron 22° 30' W.

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Sunday January 17th 1847
Begins with a Light Breeze from S.E. Steering by the wind heading
S.W. under all sail saw white water. caught one porpoise middle
part a Good Breeze from E.S.E. heading S.W. under all sail Latter
part Baffling and Rainy So Ends there 24 hours Lat by D.R. 2° 00'
Long by D.R. 24° 00'

Monday January 18th 1847
Begins with Squally weather saw one Ship heading to North
middle part Squally, and Baffling Latter part the same saw
nothing of the whale kind. So Ends there 24 hours Lat by D.R. 1° 00' N.
Long by D.R. 22° 25' W.

Tuesday January 19th 1847
Begins with Light fair wind. Squally wind from all points of the
horizon. S.W. the course we want to go, middle part the same
Latter part heading S.W. saw nothing looked like whales
So Ends there 24 hours in trying to cross the line
Lat by obs 2° 30' N.
Long by Chron 22° 00' W.

Wednesday January 20th 1847
Begins with a Light Breeze from S.E. heading S by W under
all sail. all hands busied employed At work middle part
light fair from S.E. heading S.W. under all sail. Latter part
the same So Ends there 24 hours Lat by obs 1° 15' N.
Long by Chron 24° 00' W.

Thursday January 21st 1847
Begins with Light Breeze from S.W. heading S by W under all sail
middle part Light fair from the same quarter Latter part
the same picked over our potatoes saw porpoises So Ends
Lat by obs 29 miles N.
Long by D.R. 24° 00' W.
