

Remarks Made on Board Bark Oceanic

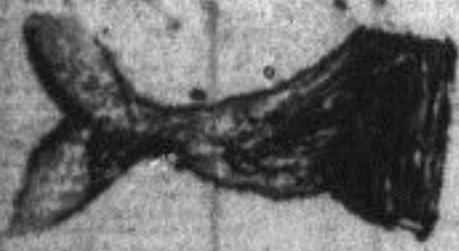
Monday February 22nd 1847
Begins with a Good Breeze from N. W. heading to Eastward under All Sail. middle part thick Looking green
Latter part. A Strong Breeze under topsails. At 10 am Left 10
So ends their 24 hours Lat 38.5
Long 72.3

Tuesday February 23rd 1847
Begins with a Gale from N. W. At 2 P.M. took in Fore top
Main sail, jib and fore for top under Close Reef Main top
Harbord tack on Board, thunder and lightning hard.
middle and latter part the same So ends their 24 hours
Lat by obs 38.5
Long by Chron 72.4



Wednesday February 24th 1847
Begins with Strong Gales from S.W. heading N.W. under
Short but saw only teeth and a piece of squid middle
Latter the wind the same squimpus and lots of white
So ends their 24 hours Lat by obs 39.5
Long by Chron 73.0

Thursday February 25th 1847
Begins with a Strong Breeze from the westward heading to north
under Double Reef topsails saw white water. Saw a school of
kind of small fish middle and latter part light winds from
S.W. caught one tooth Saw Blunt nose Grampuses So ends their
24 hours Lat by obs 39.50
Long by Chron 73.10



Friday February 26th 1847
Begins with a Light Breeze from S.W. heading to Southward
Eastward middle and latter part the same At 9 am saw
off and weather began going to windward quick, did not do
boats. So ends their 24 hours Lat by obs 39.00 Long 73.00

Cruising off the Coast of the Plateau for Sperm Whales

Saturday February 27th 1847
Begins with Light Breeze from N.E. heading to Northward. whales still in sight
middle and latter part the same saw porpoises and one
lumpfish. A Brite Lookout for whales the latter part so ends
Lat by obs 39.00
Long by Chron 73.53

Sunday February 28th 1847
Begins with Light Breeze and calm heading Eastward under all
sail saw Grampuses and lumpfish middle and latter part the same
ends their 24 hours Lat by obs 38.50 Long by Chron 74.00

Monday March 1st 1847
Begins with Light Breeze from N.W. heading N.W. under all sail
middle and latter part Light Breeze and calm saw Grampuses
and a number of Lumpfish. latter part heading North to South
these 24 hours Lat by obs 39.50
Long by Chron 75.33

Tuesday March 2nd 1847
Begins with Light Breeze and calm. Saw large school of Grampuses
Whale trying to raise a whale but without success middle
and latter part the same trying to get to Northward. Saw
and lumpfish So ends their 24 hours Lat by obs 39.25
Long by Chron 76.53

Wednesday March 3rd 1847
Begins with a Light Breeze from N.W. heading to Northward
under all sail saw Grampuses middle and latter the same
At 10 am spoke a big Calves in bay New London with 300 lbs
of Sperm oil. So ends their 24 hours Lat by obs 38.33
Long by Chron 79.21
