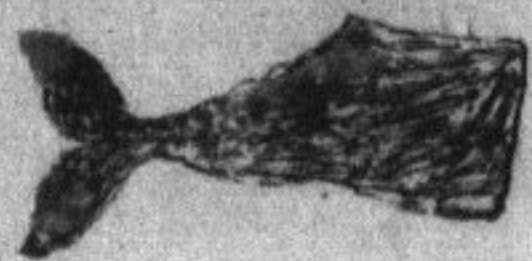


Remarks Made on Board Bark Yeoman



Sunday March 14th 1847
Begins with a Light Breeze from S.W. heading to East
middle the same At 8 AM saw whales Landed three
Boats without Success Latter part Rainy So Ends these
24 hours Lat by Obs 36.50
Long by Obs 16.40

Monday March 15th 1847
Begins with a Strong Breeze from the S.E. heading first on
one tack then on the other, the above whales in sight Landed
and the mast Boat struck and the line got out of the Ch
the whale Run Very fast to windward Being very Reef we
had to cut from him So Ends these 24 hours Lat by Obs 38.50
Long by Obs 16.50

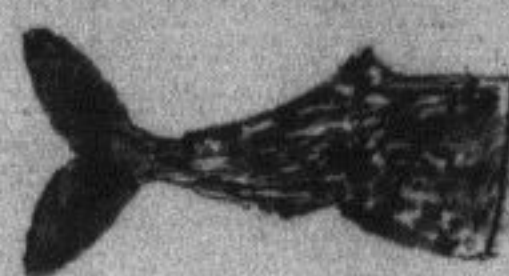
Tuesday March 16th 1847
Begins with a Strong Breeze from S.E. Lying to under Short Sail
middle and Latter part the fine Sun Low grassy. Saw
whales three 24 hours. So Ends these 24 hours. Lat by Obs 36.50
Long by Obs 16.50



Wednesday March 17th 1847
Begins with a Strong Breeze from S.E. heading to S.W. under
Sail middle part more moderate. At 10 AM saw a Large
whale Landed three Boats and Chuk all Day without Success
Saw teeth and Drift Sticks and Squid So Ends these 24 hours
Lat by Obs 36.55
Long by Obs 16.50

Thursday March 18th 1847
Begins with Light Air and Calm Chasing whales with
Success middle part light At 7 AM saw whales Landed
Boats without Success Latter part the weather short and
So Ends these 24 hours

Cruising off the River La Platte for whales



Friday March 19th 1847
Begins with Light Air and Calm Chasing whales At 8 AM
Landed Boat Struck a Large sperm whale, the whale took
the line in three minutes After the Boat was fast to him
middle and Latter part Light Air from S.W. heading S.E.
So Ends these 24 hours Lat by Obs 38.19
Long by Obs 15.00

Saturday March 20th 1847
Begins with a Light Breeze from the S.W. heading S.W.
middle and Latter Light Air, At 7 AM saw whales Landed
three Boats, Landed Boat Struck and we took him Long
Side spoke Bark Samuel Thomas with 100 lbs of oil
So Ends these 24 hours Lat by Obs 38.50
Long by Obs 15.00

Sunday March 21st 1847
Begins with Light Air from the S.W. heading S.W. commencing
Landing middle and Latter part the same wind at
Day Light commenced Lying to wind So Ends these 24
hours Lat by Obs 35.00
Long by Obs 15.50

Monday March 22nd 1847
Begins with Light Air At 6 PM had the whale all in
and commenced Boiling At 4 AM spoke Chapman
Boat Clean middle and Latter part weather short and
So Ends these 24 hours Lat by Obs



Tuesday March 23rd 1847
Begins with Light Air Still Boiling on whale At 7
AM saw whales Landed three Boats Struck Boat
Boat or whale, and we took him Long Side and Lat
in Lay So Ends these 24 hours
