

Remarks Made on Board Bark Yvonema

Wednesday March 21st 1847

Begins with good weather still boiling and at 10th o'clock
singing long light middle and latter part the same
so ends there 24 hours

Thursday March 22nd 1847

Begins with light wind still boiling at day light
commenced cutting our second whale had 1st and 2nd
lifting of him he was blasted to bad middle and
latter part good weather so ends there 24 hours

Friday March 23rd 1847

Begins with good weather still cutting at 12th o'clock
middle and in excepting his case middle and
latter part the same so ends there 24 hours

Saturday March 24th 1847

Begins with good weather commenced boiling in
second whale middle and latter part the same
brought one hundred barrels of sperm oil so ends there
24 hours

Sunday March 25th 1847

Begins with light wind still boiling a very fine
to about 12th o'clock middle and latter part the same kind
weather so ends there 24 hours

Cruising off the River La Platte for whales

Monday March 29th 1847

Begins with light wind spoke Bark North America New London
at 10th o'clock of oil at 6 P.M. got then boiling middle and
latter part the same so ends there 24 hours

Tuesday March 30th 1847

Begins with a good breeze commenced blowing down, storm
brought 50 bbls of sperm oil, at 2 P.M. saw whales found two
boats in chase whales going towards wind quick came on rain
without success so ends there 24 hours

Wednesday March 31st 1847

Begins with a strong breeze from S.E. heading to westward
middle part lashed ship, wind lashed to westward latter
part blowing a gale from S.W. lying to wind close
half main top sail so ends there 24 hours

Thursday April 1st 1847

Begins with a Caly from S.W. heading west under
springs at 9 P.M. striped sea over the stern and carried
away from that was lashed then we saved part of them
blowing very hard so ends there 24 hours

Friday April 2nd 1847

Begins with a strong breeze from the southward middle and
latter part the same saw no whales saw one sail to 4 o'clock
there 24 hours
