

Remarks Made on Board Bark Yeoman



Saturday April 3rd 1847
 Begins with a Strong Breeze from the Southward, and
 Ship heading to westward at 7 o'clock saw whales 2 or 3
 Saw South and chased them without success, so ended
 then 24 hours, Lat 34° 34' Long 40° 40'



Sunday April 4th 1847
 Begins with a Good Breeze from the Southward at 2 P.M.
 Sub-whales 2 or 3 about Starboard Port Stench of meat
 and we took him Long Side about Sun set, middle and
 Latter part Good sea the 4th Day Light commenced cutting
 at noon had him All in to bed, then 24 hours
 Lat by obs 34° 44'
 Long by Chron 40° 50'

Monday April 5th 1847
 Begins with Light wind from Northward at Sun set
 commenced Boiling at 5 o'clock spoke Big American
 Challaquin with 2000 lbs of oil, on Monomela seen
 from land her on Board of the Chawman and let her
 go, so ended then 24 hours, Lat by obs 34° 30'

Tuesday April 6th 1847
 Begins with a Strong Breeze from the Northward heading N. by E.
 at Boiling middle and Latter part of Gale from the
 Southward saw no whales then 24 hours, so ended
 Lat by obs 34° 50'
 Long by Chron 41° 30'

Wednesday April 7th 1847
 Begins with a Strong Breeze from the Southward heading
 to Westward middle part more moderate at 4 o'clock
 got them Boiling and washed off Latter part the same
 so ended then 24 hours Lat by obs 34° 18'
 Long by Chron 41° 30'

Cruising off the River La Platte for whales

Thursday April 8th 1847
 Begins with Light wind from the Eastward heading to
 the Southward and Eastward at 7 A.M. commenced Boiling
 oil middle and Latter part the same to bed then
 24 hours, Lat by obs 34° 20'
 Long by Chron 41° 20'

Friday April 9th 1847
 Begins with Light air heading S. by E under topsails
 still Boiling down oil at 4 P.M. had it All down, 6 P.M.
 middle and Latter part a Strong Breeze from the Southward
 so ended then 24 hours, Lat by obs 34° 50'
 Long by Chron 41° 50'

Saturday April 10th 1847
 Begins with a Strong Breeze from the Southward heading
 to Northward and Westward under short sail middle and
 Latter part the same, saw one Sunfish and a very heavy
 swell on to bed then 24 hours, Lat by obs 35° 19' S.
 Long by Chron 41° 10'

Sunday April 11th 1847
 Begins with a Strong Breeze from the Southward heading
 to Eastward and Westward under short sail middle
 and Latter part the same to bed then 24 hours
 Lat by obs
 Long by Chron

Monday April 12th 1847
 Begins with a Strong Breeze from the Westward heading
 to Eastward middle and Latter part the same Breeze
 saw one or two pieces of Sperm to bed then 24 hours
 Lat by obs
