

Remarks Made on Board Bark Yconom

Saturday May 24<sup>th</sup> 1847

Monday May 24<sup>th</sup> 1847  
Begins with Light breeze from the S.W. heading N. 71<sup>st</sup> miles  
with the wind from N.W. heading N.E. & N. under all sail  
At 10 A.M. came to anchor off Isl. of Grand in 12 fathoms of  
water got off one haft of water so ends there 24 hours. Lying

Tuesday May 25<sup>th</sup> 1847

Begins with Rainy weather middle part the same, At 10 A.M.  
A Potugues cutter came and ordered us in to Angry & In  
small close by where we lay, we got under way and went to the  
to wait for further orders. So ends there 24 hours they put officers  
Board and stow to Gard us.

Wednesday May 26<sup>th</sup> 1847

Begins with Rainy weather. The Potugues have our papers,  
and we do not know what to do. Lying here, went to get an  
writer middle and cutter part good weather Bailed out  
Lumpback so ends there 24 hours, Lying in Angry off the

Thursday May 27<sup>th</sup> 1847

Begins with a Light breeze from S.W. Still in the shore next  
sight of what we was taken here for middle and cutter part  
the same, the Potugues are going to take us to Rio General  
in the course of two or three days, we expect them to be clear  
so ends there 24 hours

Laying off Angry Guarded by A Cutter

Friday May 28<sup>th</sup> 1847

Begins with Good weather Still At Anchor, At 2 P.M. we had  
clear not to let any Boat come Long Side, hear we lay not  
doing any thing middle and cutter part the same so ends there  
24 hours

Saturday May 29<sup>th</sup> 1847

Begins with Good weather still Lying At Anchor Doing  
nothing, middle and cutter part the same, so ends there 24 hours

Sunday May 30<sup>th</sup> 1847

Begins with Good weather Got the Potugues At Liberty and  
they have Chalk and up to get out of the Park and go home  
middle and cutter part the same they are going to take us  
to Rio General, so they say A Brig of war is going to take us  
there, so ends there 24 hours

Monday May 31<sup>st</sup> 1847

Begins with a fine Breeze from E.S.E. Bark Still Lying  
at the shore part At Anchor, middle and cutter part the  
same, they will not let us go shore, nor leave the Bark  
so ends there 24 hours.

Tuesday June 1<sup>st</sup> 1847

Begins with Good weather Still Lying At Anchor off Angry  
At 10 A.M. A Boat from A Potugues Man of war came Long Side  
and the long handa wanted to know if we would work her  
to the Bark, to Rio General, the Capt. said we would have nothing  
to do with her, he bid her how many of the Rest of us help work  
her there, so the biggest part of us agreed to help work her there  
they would take the Responsibility upon them selves they  
agreed to do it, At 10 A.M. we moved about 10 miles from where  
we lay, Long Side of the Potugues man of war, and dropped  
Anchor the A Head, so ends there 24 hours
