

Remarks Made on Ford Park Grassmen

Sunday October the 5<sup>th</sup> 1847

begins with a strong breeze from S. finding ESE at 4.11. It sets the  
gills and murex and squids in the middle, clear and moderate at 11 P.M. See  
the reefs out of the top rails, later part the wind from S by W  
leaving SE by E. Small hands getting water so ends this day Sat 30-00  
Tues 31-02

Wednesday October the 6<sup>th</sup> 1847

Begins with a good breeze from S by SE heading SE by E. much cold  
capsul made fast clear and lit wind to be the same at goods  
lookout for whole run nothing records this day Sat 30/33  
Sony 37/07

Thursday October the 7<sup>th</sup> 1847

Begins with light breeze from S.W. by S heading S.E. by S & remains all said. About the 4th and heat of sun on middle part the same as first. Next the wind from the northwards & tearing course of sail progresses and are finished employed in t-mending it. 4th day  
Sat 31-1

Friday October the 8<sup>th</sup> 1847

Begins with a light breeze from northward steering easterly  
under all sail same and ~~improves~~ <sup>improves</sup> little past the same but  
from the wind ~~at~~ <sup>from</sup> E strong and rain implied in minding  
rains so ends this day Sat 33-19.

Saturday, October the 9<sup>th</sup>

Begins with a strong breeze from the N.E. hurried to the woods heading S by E took in the top gallinetrails and doubled back to the top trails, took the wind boat and caught a little while the same later part the wind headed round to the S by W. Last heading S by W shook the eggs out of the top trails, and set many gallinetrail seeds this day saw two finchicks. Sub 73-45

Sunday October 10<sup>th</sup> 1847

Bays with at least five from 88 up returning course & all sail except fore top galled sail and flying jib garbled. A school of porpoises struck all about last hour, especially in mackerel sea, while part kept lower down but the wind had to the 1<sup>st</sup> hour on fire back so early this day. Lat. 33-48 Long 34 07

Remarks Made On Board Ship Ypman

Monday, October 11<sup>th</sup> 1847

begin with it strong breeze from W. by N. clearing over to my S  
under all sail made fast the same later part the wind from 75° S 30°  
all hands employed looking out for water and one full of flour and one  
of pork saw greenback sawed this day. Sat 23: 34: 9  
Long

Sunday October 12<sup>th</sup>

Began with a good breeze from NW & strong easterly & SE winds all mid-  
dle part the same latter part light breeze from SE & backing  
& 1<sup>st</sup> saw several finch all kinds mixed in the morning early in the  
this day

Wednesday October 13<sup>th</sup>

Begin with a moderate breeze from SE blowing E & E under all  
with all hands employ mending sails while part the same water  
strong breeze and squally the wind SE by E & backing of E by E  
at 11 all took in top gallant sails & made the way  
at

Thursday October 14<sup>th</sup>

Begin with strong and square, from SE by E heading NE by E  
under lap sails under part the wind headed to NE. Each ship heading  
~~strong~~ course ESE not the top galant sails and flying gill. latter part  
rain we schools of porpoises sa onds this day Sat 32-189

Yarn with it strong breeze and rain <sup>here</sup> N.E. by E. increasing  
course S.E. under all sail except flying jibs at 3 P.M. took  
in gaff topsail and fore topgallant sail at 4 P.M. doubled back  
to topsails at 6 P.M. took in gaff and main sail at 11 do took in the fore  
mast and close reefed the main topsail latter part blowing it gail at 1. till  
one in fore sail and set the fore spruce at 9 do not the fore sail at 11 do  
and make set the fore topsail and set one of out of the main topsail towards the  
bow
