Monday November 21st 1844

Begins with moderate breeze from E & S heading S & E under all sail and passengers at sunset shortened sail at daylight made sail at 10. Tact ship heading to the Northward so ends this day

Tuesday November 22nd

Begins with moderate breeze from E & S heading S & E by N under all sail runs white water and passengers at 6 P.M. make the South Doctor Landing at Westport 5 miles out 100 lbs of specie out saw one another sail steering to the Northward made part the same later light breeze and hailing or accompanied with squally showers evening inclement with the South Doctor Landing so ends this day

Wednesday November 23rd

Begins with light and hailing winds with thick and rainy weather under all sail saw one sail steering on the wind to the Northward saw white water at sunset shortened sail heading S & E the wind from E made part the same later saw one sail insight saw small white water so ends this day

Thursday November 24th

Begins with light breeze from E heading S & E under all sail saw small white water at sunset shortened sail made part the same later at 10 P.M. more ship heading to the Northward made part the same later the wind from N heading E & S saw three sails and one grasspass off hands employed sailing down the river so ends this day

Friday November 25th

Begins with moderate breeze from N heading E & S under all sail saw small white water broke out at 11 A.M. kept on till 6 P.M. of moderate at sunset shortened sail made and later the same saw white water so ends this day

Remarks made On Board Bark Yaman

Saturday November 26th 1844

Begins with moderate breeze from N & W heading S & E under all sail at 1 P.M. took ship heading W by N made part the same later strong breeze and plenty of rain at 10 P.M. double reefed the topsail and took in the gill spanker and mizzen so ends this day

Sunday November 27th

Begins with strong breeze from N & W heading W by N under double reef topsail thick and rainy at 5 P.M. more ship heading S & E made part the same later the wind backed to S & W took at 6 A.M. Tact ship heading S & E so ends this day

Monday November 28th

Begins with moderate breeze from S & W heading S & E under all sail saw white water at sunset shortened sail no much made part the same later strong breeze from S & E at daylight kept off S & W saw grasspass and passengers so ends this day

Tuesday November 29th

Begins with strong breeze from S & W steering across S by W under double reef topsail at sunset shortened sail and kept to the wind with one starboard tack at 6 A.M. heading S & W made part the same later part at daylight made sail and kept off S by W saw white water displaced in fishing miring topsail buckled so ends this day

Thursday November 30th

Begins with strong breeze from S & W steering across S by E under all sail at sunset shortened sail made part the same later strong S & W all hands employed fishing miring rigging so ends this day

Begins with moderate breeze from S & W steering across S & W under all sail saw one grasspass at sunset took in the mizzen topsail and made part the same later steering S & W made part the same
