

Remacks Made On Board Each Evening

Sunday December 12 1844

Begins with light strong fog from D.F. heading E. water and
a deep fog all around at 4.45 on the coast at 6 P.m. sent down the
four topmast and fired a mortar at sunset thirteen and
noble and Walter had the same new greenpans, so ends this day

Monday December 13th

Begins with light breeze from S & E heading S & W while
all sail run grasspastes at 5 P.M. beat ship heading S & W
at sunset shortened sail as several miles past the same later part
the wind shifted to S & E at 1 P.M. kept off S & W with grasspastes
and tulle all round at once and the topsail so over their way.

Sunday December 14th

Bignon with light breeze from S.E. steering course S. 8 1/2 W. and
 all sail at sunset. Spectant sail went light to the sunset. Heav-
 ily S. 8 1/2 W. made fast the same at daylight. Red the port top 1
 and left it and got and mininail at 7 am. Shept off S. 1/2 W. by 11
 at 11 am hauled up. Why it ran white water but all hands at work
 on the topside so ends This day.

Begin with 6 strong beets from N.E. starting across W by the under
cept fragments at sunset southwest side and were ship heading E & E
first the same later at equally not rain at 11 am severe ship
ing at W by the self hands still at work on the sun some weather

Begins with strong breeze from N.E. by the steering are the
 evening the 1st of July the under reef topsails set 3 P.M. look-
 the gill out maintained at 6 P.M. spoke the 3d Ship Hancock

 look in the fore topsail made fast the same at 11 at day
 set the fore topsail reefed thick and rain it much this day
 Sat. Oct 21

Began with strong wind and thick and rain from N & heavy at 3 P.M. the wind shifted to N.W. & at 4 P.M. with pleasant weather at sunset took in fore top and and hauled to the wind N.W. & at 4 P.M. hauled to 7 P.M. all hands employed on the sail so over this day 28269

Thursday November 18th

begin with strong breeze from the S & S E heading E at 8 miles and
all sail at 3 PM took in the main top gallant mast and were sent stand-
ing to northward at sunset sometimes sail with more sheet in the
S W by W made fast the same before dark at daylight made sail at
4 PM took ship to E S E all hands still impatient wth the slow
sailing of the whole kind. &c. ends this diary Sat 28 1848

Sunday December 19th

Begin with a strong local flow S E steering on the west E. S. E under but topsoils at 3' S. W. are bent the pore topsoil with bent a number run of soil steering to like the south west it moves when bent ship to 9' S. W. with shortbeds soil with part the same later part at double more soil run with water on one the shore

Monday December 26th

begins with a good breeze & steering on the wind. I & E make all sail run a sail steering to the surface some white water at 5 P.M. two ships to report at sunset shortened sail with part the same later part at daylight make sail and tack ship to E & E run to sea and compass all hands still at work on the sail so ends this day.

160 Obs

Sunday December 21st

begins with a strong breeze from E steering on the wind SSE
under full top sails with 10 fathoms of hump no vessel observed sail
visible until the sun in the west at daylight must sail the vessel hauled
to the light off S and squally breeze with few waves and deep water
off of peak at 10 left the top sails the wind shifted to SSE in evening
18 so ends this day Sat 22 53 5
