

Remarks Made On Board Bark Yveeman P

Thursday February 10th 1848

Begins with a strong breeze from N. by W steering course N. for the
Briske light under easy sail top sails and courses at sunset let the
sails out of the top sails and set hole reaches mill part the same
later just light breeze and calm and thick rain weather comes
from off points of the cape and so ends this day N. by W.

Friday February 11th

Begins with light breeze and calm thick fog the wind
from all points of the compass mill part the same later part the
wind W and fine weather clearing course N. by W from Cape and
perforated beach out for beach. Ends this day Sat 42.22
Long 37.58 W

Saturday February 12th

Begins with a light breeze from W steering course N. by E
under all sails ~~the wind from the fore top sail and courses~~
foggy and squally mill part the wind hauled to N. by W with it
strong breeze at 4 am took on the main top sail and sails so ends
this day Sat 41.76
Long 47.38 W

Sunday February 13th

Begins with a strong breeze from N. by W steering on the wind
N. by E under all sails sails were set to N. by E while part the same
later part at 2 PM more wind kept the top sails at daylight let
the fore top sail and spunkies at 10 am so ends this day on the fore
sail and fore top sail and do not set the main sail and spunkies
rounds this day Sat 40.07
Long 47.38 W

Monday February 14th

Begins with a strong breeze from N. by W steering N. by W
under all sails at 4 PM more wind kept the top sails at sunset
hauled to N. by W and more sails set the fore top sail and top sail
at 10 am N. by W mill part the same at daylight wind at sail
to the N. by W ends this day Sat 39.50
Long 48.23 W

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Tuesday February 15th 1848

Begins with a strong breeze from the Southward steering course N. by W
under all sails top sails 2 PM the wind hauled to N. by E at sunset spoke the
whale ship Herring of Portland P. Co's master thirty eight hundred
lbs of milk and sperm oil at sunset the captain went on board there
9 PM shortened sail so ends this day mill and looks O by
the same

Wednesday February 16th

Begins with a strong breeze from N. by E heading N. by E under all top
sails the ship Herring still in sight evening at one hour sails at sunset
shorten sail mill part the same later part at sunset sails
made sail so ends the wind hauled to N. by W under one fore top sail
and sails this day Sat 37.25 W
Long 47.42 W

Thursday February 17th

Begins with a strong breeze from N. by W heading N. by E under
all top sails and courses at sunset shorten sail for the night
under part the wind hauled to N. by W steering course N. by E later part
at daylight wind hauled out for water at 8 am spoke of New
Orleans ship 60 days from New York bound to Valparaiso
captain went on board and got some papers so ends this day
Sat 37.55 W
Long 47.42 W

Friday February 18th

Begins with a moderate breeze from N. by E steering course N. by E under all
top sails and courses wind from N. by E and spunkies at sunset shorten sail
mill part the same later part right wind and calm rounds this day
Sat 37.25 W
Long 47.54 W

Saturday February 19th

Begins with light breeze and calm from N. by E heading N. by E under all
sails 3 PM let ship to N. by W at sunset sails off one fore top sail
same mill part the same later part same so ends this day
Sat 36.58 W
Long 48.21 W
