

On 4th moved to the Western Ground on the shore

Sunday May 14th 1848

Begins with a light breeze from S.E. heading S.S.W. under all sail in the covers of the after noon last 26 number of times Patrick Morrison is on the deck last occasioned by trying to run away from the vessel. Beginning all hands employed in securing the anchors at 9 P.M. the wind shifted to S.E. heading S.E. later part at 10 P.M. speak the Ship "Harriet" Barker master bound to San Francisco. So ends this day.

Monday May 15th

Begins with a moderate breeze from S.E. heading E.S.E. under all sail still in company with the "Harriet" of St. Francis. Middle and latter part the same employed painting the Starboard boat and putting new fore sails. So ends this day. Sub 24.22 Sat 41.47

Tuesday May 16th

Begins with a light breeze from S.E. heading E.S.E. under all sail. Trying to get to the northward middle and latter part the same run at full sail. So ends this day. Sub 24.00

Wednesday May 17th

Begins with a light breeze from S.E. heading E.S.E. under all sail employed in heading new fore sails. Middle part squalls of wind and rain. Latter part strong breeze from S.E. at 7 P.M. in company with Sub "Harriet" and fore topgallant sail so ends this day. Sub 24.37.5

Thursday May 18th

Begins with a strong breeze from S.E. heading E.S.E. under all sail. Fairbanks all the night in place mending a topmast at 10 P.M. took in the main topgallant and in the fore at 3 P.M. kept the topmast 44 miles this day. Sub 24.50 Tony 36.03

Friday May 19th 1848

Begins with a strong breeze from S.E. heading E.S.E. under Reeft Topmast. Gilt and courses middle part the same. Latter part more moderate at 2 P.M. the Reeft out of the topmast all hands employed repairing it. Topmast. So ends this day. Sub 24.33.5

Saturday May 20th

Begins with a moderate breeze from S.E. heading E.S.E. under all sail. Fairbanks fore topgallant sail and Reeft. Middle part the same. Latter part hailing winds at 4 P.M. last to 5 at 7 P.M. last. Began S.E. all hands at work on the sail. Break out for water so ends this day. Sub 24.41.9

Sunday May 21st

Begins with hailing winds and pleasant weather trying to get to the northward still employed on the sail at sunset a breeze from S.E. heading S.E. middle part the same. Latter part strong breeze at 4 P.M. kept the topmast the wind from S.E. heading S.E. so ends this day. Sub 23.50.8 Tony 35.16.5

Monday May 22nd

Begins with a strong breeze from S.E. heading E.S.E. under Reeft. Topmast. Gilt and courses at 7 P.M. took in the fore. Under and fore topmast. Latter part at 4 P.M. began to blow. Reft the fore topmast. Under the wind shifted to S.W. with a heavy squall of wind and rain kept off S.E. at daylight. More moderate wind and so ends this day. Sub 24.00

Tuesday May 23rd

Begins with a strong breeze from S.E. heading E.S.E. under all sail. Fairbanks middle and latter part pleasant weather. Break out for water and bread and mended and the sail. So ends this day. Sub 24.43.5 Tony 34.59
