

Remarks Made On Board Bark Yeastum

Wednesday May 24th 1848

Begins with pleasant weather the wind from S course
N.E. under all sail one Bark and Brig in company with
10 all hands employed on the Sloop at sunset the wind shifted
to S.E. latter half the wind Bark still in sight no sails
This day Lat 19, 25
Long 34, 57

Thursday May 25th 1848

Begins with squally weather and hailing rain
one bark in sight at 3 P.M. had the wind from S.E.
steering course S.E. under all sail middle part the same
latter part at 10 P.M. on board the Fore Sloop and
part to weather to end this day 17, 68

Friday May 26th 1848

Begins with light breeze from S.E. steering E under
all sail one Bark still in company with us at 5 P.M.
lost to us the wind from S.W. fine pleasant weather
one rather sail in sight middle part at 4 P.M. hailing
windy latter part shook the wing from S.E. still employed
repairing the Sloop on end this day 18, 47

Saturday May 27th 1848

Begins with light breeze from E steering course
N.E. by S.E. under all sail at 2 P.M. lost the other
fore Sloop's starboard middle part pleasant weather latter part
lost a main topmast starboard two sails in sight
employed repairing the Sloop Lat 17, 47
Long

Sunday May 28th 1848

Begins with light fresh winds from E.S.E. course S.E.
by S.E. under all sail at 4 P.M. the clothes that the men
left that runaway visible and latter pleasant weather
see one Ship steering to S.W. at end this day
Lat 16, 13

On the Passage to the Western Islands &c

Monday May 29th 1848

Begins with moderate fresh from E.S.E. steering course
S.E. by E under all sail in sight in sight middle part
and latter part strong breeze at 5 P.M. taking the Sloop
gill in flood in hauling out for water and repairing it
Sail to end this day Lat 14, 26
Long 34, 18

Tuesday May 30th 1848

Begins with moderate fresh from S.E. steering course
S.E. by E under all sail and pleasant weather in flood
repairing of Sloop middle part the same latter part
strong breeze set in the Sloop giving us 40 ends this day
Lat 12, 56
Long 33, 48

Wednesday May 31st 1848

Begins with strong S.E. fresh steering course S.E.
by E and pleasant weather under all sail in sight rep.
arriving the Sloop middle part the same latter part at
10 P.M. took in the Sloop gill and missed topmast stand
to end this day Lat 09, 55
Long 33, 07

Thursday June 1st 1848

Begins with strong fresh from S.E. steering course S.E.
by E under all sail except the Sloop gill and missed
topmast stand middle part the same latter part employed
in repairing the main Boat run two sails steering to
S.W. to end this day Lat 07, 48
Long

Friday June 2nd 1848

Begins with a strong breeze from S.E. steering course
S.E. by E under all sail employed repairing the Boat
middle part squally at latter part at 4 took in the
fore topmast stand sail and standing 40 ends at this day
Lat 05, 07
31, 55
