

Remarks Made On Board Bark Yeoman

Friday July 13th 1848

Begins with light breeze from the Eastward, heading to the Westward, imploded steam down the oil at 1 Pm. & whole of Green Whales might leave the boat and eat two milk and butter part pleasant weather so much this day

Sat 31, 37
Long 46 30

Saturday July 14th

Begins with pleasant weather all hands imploded steam down the oil at 1 Pm. & whole of Green Whales leaving along side at 2 Pm. board the boat for more milk without success, visible part the same butter part at daylight eat in the netles so much this day

Sunday 15th

Begins with light breeze from S.E. heading E. and imploded steam down the oil at 8 Pm. finish laying some Greenhouses so much this day

Monday July 16th

Begins with pleasant weather the wind from S.E. heading S.W. at sunset light to the wind and whole milk butter part imploded steam down the oil so much this day

Tuesday July 18th

Begins with light breeze from S.E. heading E.S.E. all hands imploded steam down the oil at 1 Pm. were left to S.W. at sunset left to the wind and whole milk butter part imploded steam down the oil so much this day clearing

Cruising On the Western Frontiers South Atlantic

Wednesday June 17th 1848

Begins with moderate breeze from E. & steering course S.W. & under all sail imploded steam down the oil at 4 Pm. left to the wind with our harbor light ahead at sunset whole milk butter part the same latter part at 4 Pm. were left to S.W. & at daylight made sail so much this day

Sat 31, 57
Long 46

Thursday June 20th

Begins with moderate breeze from E. & heading S.W. & under all sail saw two whales enroute with part the same latter part at 7 Pm. spoke the Bark ~~Yeoman~~ De Frankling of Westport. Weather 13 miles out 3.30 left Green and to boiling out at sunset. All whole at 8 Pm. to S.W. & so much this day

Sat 31, 27
Long 48 17

Friday June 21st

Begins with light breeze from E. heading S.W. & under all sail saw one whale enroute to S.W. imploded steam down the oil at 8 Pm. went down the top of Galveston Island and about to fit the part there so much this day

Sat 31 57

Saturday June 22nd

Begins with light breeze from E. heading S.W. & under all sail all hands imploded steam down the oil at 4 Pm. sent it at sunset at sunset whole milk butter part the same imploded steam down the oil so much this day

Sat 31 47
Long 48, 17

Sunday July 23rd

Begins with light breeze from S.E. heading E.S.E. under all sail trying to get to the Eastward saw 10 miles of Green at sunset took in the light sail and left the top of Galveston Island with the same latter part had the wind from S.W. steering course E. saw white water so much this day
