Thursday 13-1902 these day begins with light southerly wind and rainy running steer S. by E. latter part the same Tucker in sight so ends

Friday 14-1902 these day begins with light southerly wind and clear weather running steer N. by E. tucker in sight saw grampers and porpoises latter part the same at sun set short down to lower topsails so ends Lat 31.18 Long 43.27

Saturday 15-1902 these day begins with light air from southern steer S. by E. Tucker in sight latter part the same broke out water beams and sugar kill a hog so ends Lat 31.02 Long 43.20

Sunday 16-1902 these day begins with calm and clear spool S. by E. Tucker saw school of whales and killers grampers agerins latter part light easterly winds so ends

Monday 17-1902 these day begins with fine weather wind from east heading northern saw grampers at 1.30. p. m. come heavy squally and rain at 5.40. p. m. raised a large whale to late saw one risen tucker out of sight so ends
