

Aug Sunday 31-1902 these day begins with
fresh southwesterly winds and steady
weather saw two humpbacks latter
part the same running steer E. 1/2 E
whole sail out so ends
Lat 37.15 Long 36.45

Sept Monday 1-1902 these day begins with
fresh southwesterly winds and rainy
squally latter part moderate some
wind from NE. the whole sail out
steer by the wind so ends
Lat 38.25 Long 33.56

Sept Tuesday 2-1902 these day begins with
light northerly winds and cloudy
weather off the point words
latter part the same steer E. by
S. 1/2 S. so ends Lat 38.20 Long 32.00

Sept Wednesday 3-1902 these day begins with
light southwesterly winds and clear
weather repairing sails fore sail
gib flying gib latter part the
same steer E. by S. so ends
Lat 38.15 Long 30.46

Sept Thursday 4-1902 these day begins with
light southerly wind and over
cast at 9 a.m. high fog at
out fore the night so ends

Sept Friday 5-1902 these day begins with
light southerly winds at 7 a.m.
come to anchor in side of
the brack water so ends
at 9 a.m. haul to the
morning so ends

1.5 ft send on board 60 Bushels of sweet potatoes 85
40. panguet 1.7. case of corn 1.5. Bushels

Thursday 2-1902 these begins with fine
weather at 4 p.m. start to sea with
whole sail out also the brig harrow
smith sail at the same time latter
part the same steer NW. ~~to sea~~ four
men descending sail with 24 man
all told ship four men one office
and cooper two seamen so ends

Friday 3-1902 these day begins with
fine with light easterly winds and
heavy swell brig in sight light on
the latter part so ends

Saturday 4-1902 these day begins with
fresh SW. winds and rainy weather
drop down a boat and capt went
on shore at 4 p. come on board latter
part moderate some so ends

Sunday 5-1902 these day begins with
calm and rainy weather drop a boat
and capt went on shore to get provisions
to go on shore and get potatoes at
1 p.m. come on board so ends

Monday 6-1902 these day begins with light
easterly winds and squally weather went
on shore with three boats on gentle delgado
came off at 11 a.m. with two boats load
of potatoes latter part heaving off and
on but could not get back so ends

Tuesday 7-1902 these day begins with fresh
northerly winds and clear 8.30 a.m.
saw five boats chase school of
small whale then got faster
