Nov. Wednesday 12-1902 these day begins with light breezes and cloudy weather repair super top sail steer by the wind latter part the same one sail in sight five master schooner so ends Sat 08.02 Long 24.13

Nov. Thursday 13-1902 these day begins with light southeasterly winds and squally weather one bark in sight a steamer head to the southwards brook out water steer by the wind heading S.W. the whale sail out latter part the same so ends Sat 08.02 Long 24.13

Nov. Friday 14-1902 these day begins with squally weather 4 sails in sight at 7.30 a.m. Laurence Domingos come to the captain with a black eye that Manuel Alves give him in the night captain order the mate to put him in the cold decide not and clear that fore the fight so the will not fight again on board of these vessel saw black fish 5 sails in sight steer by the wind heading W. SW. latter part the same so ends Sat 5.17. N. Long 25.10 W.

Nov. Saturday 15-1902 these day begins with light southerly winds and squally weather two sails in sight latter part the same so ends Sat 04.42 N.

Nov. Sunday 16-1902 these day begins with fresh southerly winds and cloudy three sails in sight latter part the same saw porpoise so ends Sat 03.42. N. Long 24.54

Nov. Monday 17-1902 these day begins with light southerly winds and cloudy weather one sail in sight latter part the same heading E. by S. on starboard track so ends Sat 03.04 N. Long 27.33

Nov. Tuesday 18-1902 these day begins with light southerly winds and cloudy weather three sails in sight latter part the same steer by the wind heading SW. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. so ends Sat 03.36. N. Long 27.03 W.

Nov. Wednesday 19-1902 these day begins with fresh southerly winds and cloudy weather 4 sails in sight latter part the same so ends Sat 2.20 N. Long 28.18 W.
