

Jan Saturday 17-1903 these day begins with light northeast winds and cloudy weather get true boiling at 8.30 a.m. pump out water and stored oil down latter part wind southwest light rain one cask of oil left on deck still a hog so ends set up shackle the last on board so ends

Jan Sunday 18-1903 these day begins with light southerly winds and overcast latter part clear running steer NW. latter W. at sun set short down two lower top sails steer W. saw grampers stored the oil down and clear up decks so ends
Lat 33.31 Long 46.26

Jan Monday 19-1903 these day begins with fresh easterly winds and thick weather under short sail heading to the north latter part the same at 4.30 p.m. were ship heading ESE. under two lower top sails stay sail so ends
Lat 32.50 Long 46.41

Jan Tuesday 20-1903 these day begins with fresh easterly gale and thick weather latter part moderate same with squalls hereunder very low 29.5.10 at sun set took in fore lower top sail bend new mizen stay so ends
Lat 33.12 Long 46.46

Wednesday 21-1903 these day begins with heavy gale from the west with heavy squalls lay under three stay sails latter part moderate some and clear up so ends

Thursday 22-1903 these day begins with fresh northwesterly winds and clear weather running steer east two merchant men in sight latter part moderate at sun set short down sail under two lower top sails saw black fish so ends
Lat 32.22 Long 44.53

Friday 23-1903 these day begins with fresh northerly winds and clear weather at 2.30 p.m. heavy squalls from the northwest struck latter part calm under short sail so ends
Lat 31.56 Long 43.53

Saturday 24-1903 these day begins with calm and clear weather at 1 p.m. light breeze from northeast and cloudy latter part the same saw grampers so ends
Lat 31.46 Long 43.47

Sunday 25-1903 these day begins with squalls from SW. at 9 a.m. made sail and start off steer SE. by all one sail in sight latter part clear and moderate home the whole sail set so ends
