

June Tuesday 2-1903 these day begins with light S.W. winds and overcast at 11 a.m. raised a breck living ways off but did not see anything more latter part fresh up and drizzling saw one sail so ends  
Lat 31.05

June Wednesday 3-1903 these day begins with heavy S.W. gale and cloudy latter part the same lay to under two lower top sails so ends  
Lat 31.15 Long 57.44

June Thursday 4-1903 these day begins with light northeasterly winds and heavy small cloudy latter part the same so ends

June Friday 5-1903 these day begins with light northeasterly winds drizzling latter part the same saw grampers heading to the northern and W. under short sail brockle out beef the last on the cask so ends  
Lat 30.51 Long 51.33

June Saturday 6-1903 these day begins with light easterly winds and finally weather latter part clear and calm brockle and flour last on the cask so ends

June Sunday 7-1903 these day begins with light northeasterly winds and thick weather the whole sail out heading to the northern and east latter part the same at sun set short down sail so ends  
Lat 30.38 Long 51.05

June Monday 8-1903 these day begins with light northeasterly winds and thick weather saw porpoises latter part the same the whole sail out heading N.W. steer by the wind so ends  
Lat 30.54 Long 51.04

June Tuesday 9-1903 these day begins with light northeasterly winds thick weather one steamer grampers the whole sail out over board the windles and paint latter part clear at sun set short down so ends  
Lat 31.22 Long 49.58

June Wednesday 10-1903 these day begins with light northeasterly winds thick weather at 8 a.m. raised two large whales drop three boats got fast at 11.30 a.m. came a long side got dinner and the cutting gear up at 1 p.m. start cutting at 7 p.m. got the head off and body in got supper and set the watch at 8 p.m. so ends sinclair lay up sick
