Wednesday 1-1903 these day begins with calm and squally part out water and stored down the oil at 4 p.m. got true clear up the decks and wash off. Saw black fish so ends

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Thursday 2-1903 these day begins with calm and clear latter part light southeasterly winds steer N. the whale sail out at sun set took in fore top gaffnut sail main sail saw grampars so ends Sat 30.50 Gang 49.42

July

Friday 3-1903 these day begins with light southeasterly winds and clear at 4 a.m. raised school of small whales drop down got a small cow and a calf S.B. got stone bad cutt them in made him at 10.2 p.m. cooper was ground a knife and play with the man that time the stone he cut the man in the leg below the knee capt put him on the spurs fore a short time latter part a schooner in sight put a new boat off and the stone one on the house so ends Sat 31.14 Gang 49.49

July

Saturday 4-1903 these day begins with light southerly winds and clear weather running steer N. at 10 a.m. spoke Simonmans at 120 p.m. raised a lone whale drop three boats did not have any chance. come on board at 4.30 p.m. start the word at sun set short down sail so ends Sat 31.50 Gang 49.53

Sunday 5-1903 these day begins with fresh SW. winds and thick weather running steer N. got true bailing at 8 a.m. latter part the same at sun set short down sail so ends Sat 32.36 Gang 50.32

Monday 6-1903 these day begins with fresh SW. winds and squally weather latter part moderate same stored the oil down under short sail at sun set took in gib spars and top sail saw a cacas so ends

Tuesday 7-1903 these day begins with light northerly winds and clear latter part calm flagging cuss at 4 p.m. spoke Burd dim beam so ends Sat 38.35 Gang 50.41

Wednesday 8-1903 these day begins with light southerly winds and light rain running steer N. sun beam in sight also running latter part heavy rain strong breeze from E.S.E. under two lower topsails at sun set docking foretop sail got S.B. up on the upper fleet still rain heavy at 8 p.m. so ends

Thursday 9-1903 these day begins with fresh westerly winds and clear weather saw cacas latter part wind SW. and squally the whale sail out at sun set short down so ends Sat 34.25 Gang 50.18
