April Tuesday 5-1904 these day begins with light breads and cloudy weather steer w. latter part the same scarp iron and paint so ends Gat 13:07 Gang 55:55

April Wednesday 6-1904 these day begins with fresh breads and thick weather saw black fish running steer w. latter part the same scarp out beef now cash 5 barrels so ends Gat 12:57 Gang 58:16

April Thursday 7-1904 these day begins with fresh breads and thick weather at 4 a.m. made barbadors light at 8. drop a boat captain went on shore and got the letter at 11 a.m. start fore dominica the whole sail out steer NW by N $\frac{1}{2}$ N. latter part the same so ends

April Friday 8-1904 these day begins with fresh breads and thick weather come to anchor at 2:30 p.m. foredredging the sail so ends

April Saturday 9-1904 these day begins with fine weather wash off the vessel out side so ends

April Sunday 10-1904 these day begins with fine weather one watch went on shore so ends

April Monday 11-1904 these day begins with good weather pump out water ready to paint so ends

April Tuesday 12-1904 these day begins with rain got two raft of water fuel fore latter part the same so ends

April Wednesday 13-1904 these day begins with fine weather got some water so ends

April Thursday 14-1904 these day begins with fine weather paint ship out side sands

April Friday 15-1904 these day begins with fine weather paint mast and yards so ends Samuel Rogers Dezenting

April Saturday 16-1904 these day begins with fine weather brode out beef and got one drift water and fish finish paint out sight so ends

April Sunday 17-1904 these day begins with fine weather one watch went on shore so ends

April Monday 18-1904 these day begins with fine weather set up some shooks and got some water so ends

April Tuesday 19-1904 these day begins with fine weather flaying cash and set up head gear and bend sail so ends
