Remarks on Board Tuesday March 14th 1837
Commences with fresh breeze & squally weather
Wind from N.W. steering to the N.W. employed
bending some new sails Middle part under a close
refted main topsail at daylight set double refted topsail
at 8 AM had a heavy squall from S.W. took in
sail again veered ship to the N.W. under close refted
main topsail so ends this 24 hours Lat 34° 48' S
Long by Chron 54° 48' W

Remarks on Board Wednesday March 15th
Attends with heavy gales from S.W. with overcast
Weather laying to under close refted main topsail Middle
part in motion at daylight set single refted topsails & returned
S.W. employed mending sails a strong breeze with
passing clouds so ends Lat 34° 44' S
Long by Chron 54° 57' W

Remarks on Board Thursday March 16th
Commences with strong breeze with passing clouds steering
N.W. under single refted topsails wind from S.W. &
employed mending sail Middle part lay under a main
topsail at daylight call all hands & made sail steered to
the West Latter part fine weather wind at N.W. &
so goes saw nothing dry times Lat 34° 45' S
Long by Chron 54° 00' W

Remarks on Board Friday March 17th
Commences light winds & fine weather steering East
with all sail out wind from N.W. employed repairing
sail at 6 PM shorten sail for the night Middle part
the same at daylight made sail Latter part weather
good saw nothing so ends this 24 hours Lat 34° 44' S
Long by Chron 54° 00' W

Remarks on Board Saturday March 18th 1837
Attends with a moderate breeze & good weather wind from
N.W. & steering E by N employed mending sails & at 6 PM
shorten sail for the night Middle part fine Latter
part weather the same & goes whales employed cleaning ship
so goes this 24 hours Lat 34° 48' S
Long by Chron 54° 05' W

Remarks on Board Sunday March 19th
Commences fine weather wind from N.W. & steering
E by N with all sail out at 6 PM took to the N.W. & back
to go & mizen topgallantsails & fly jib Middle
part weather fine standing to the N.W. at daylight made
all sail took ship to the E.S.E. Latter part fine weather
with a smooth sea so ends this 24 hours & no fish
Lat 34° 46' S
Long by Chron 54° 51' W

Remarks on Board Monday March 20th 1837
Commences with fine weather wind from N.W. & steering
East with all sail saw nothing at 6 PM took in fly jib
go & mizen topgallantsails Middle part weather the same
Latter part a whale sail breeze steering E.N.E. with all
sail out employed repairing old sail turning hanks &
so goes this 24 hours & no fish Lat 34° 35' S
Long by Chron 54° 42' W

Remarks on Board Tuesday March 21st
Attends with a fresh breeze from North steering
E by E heavy weather employed repairing sails turning
hanks & Middle part weather much the same at
6 PM hauled in at South with fresh gales steering
E by E with light sails in employed mending the fore
mast & so ends

Lat by Account 33° 49' S
Long by Account 54° 00' W
