Remarks on Board Monday June 19th

Commences with strong wind from S.W. accompanied with light squalls of rain with a tremendous swell on stowing down under close reefed main topsail & fore sail Barometer 30 below 50 Middle part wind hauld in to the W.N.W. & equally Latter part the same Barometer at 29 800 hundredths laying under close reef. Main topsail & staysails employed breaking out the stowage & scraping out the gunnys so gone this 24 hours

Remarks on Board Tuesday June 20th

Attends with strong breezes accompanied with squalls of rain laying under a main topsail close reefed employed stowing of the stowage Middle part weather rather better Barometer on the rise but very slow Middle part no alteration Latter part weather a little better set double reef topsails steered N.E. saw finbacks employed washing ship so gone this 24 hours

Remarks on Board Wednesday June 21st

Fresh breezes from W.N.W. with passing clouds steering N.E. at 1 P.M. shorten sail for the night Middle part weather the same Latter part set single reefed topsails steered E.S.E. light squalls of rain at 8 P.M. took the job in so gone this day & no fish

Remarks on Board Thursday June 22nd

Attends with fresh breezes from West accompanied with light squalls of rain steering E.S.E. under single reefed topsails at sunset shorten sail for the night & luffed to the wind to the N.W. Barometer rising very slow at 3 P.M. water discoloured Middle part weather fine Latter the same at 1 P.M. made all sail & steered E.N.E. water light & clear so gone

Remarks on Board Friday June 23rd

Commences with fresh breezes from west steering E.S.E. with all sail set at 12 past meridian saw the Light 2 points of the harbor bow to 2 points toward the lee beam or starboard beam at 1 P.M. took ship & hauld sharp on the wind headed up S.W. at 1 P.M. took ship headed up N.W. double reef for the night at 1 P.M. got 1/2 & found the Chron to agree with the Land Middle part weather fine Latter part the same at daylight made all sail steering N.W. at 11 P.M. weather rather darker finbacks in gale

Remarks on Board Saturday June 24th

Moderate breezes from W.N.W. & fine steering N.W. employed repairing old sails bent a main topsail at 1 P.M. shorten sail for the night Barometer 30 below 50 Middle part fine weather Latter part the same got a Lunar distance & the sexton 13 miles to the westward of the Chronometer saw finbacks so gone this fine day & fish

Leatt 28.46 South Long by Chron 111.18 East

Remarks on Board Sunday June 25th

Fine breezes & good steering to N.W. with all sail saw finback the Barometer at a stand did not rise nor fall at 1 P.M. shorten sail for the night Middle part weather fine Latter part the same all sail set saw porpoises & finbacks at 11 P.M. got a Lunar Obs & made the sexton 22 miles to westward of the Chron so gone this day

Remarks on Board Monday June 26th

Pleasant weather with fine breeze from S.W. steering N.W. with all sails set paper large rips full of a sort of weed resembling the Gull weed & killed the fish bones at sunset shorten sail for night Middle part fine Latter part the same steered N.E. got a Lunar Obs & made the sexton 19 miles to the westward of the Chron
