

Ship Young Phoenix Ocean 1839

Remarks on Board Tuesday June 27th

Commences with fresh breezes from S.E. steering S.E. employed mending sails at 6 P.M. came to the wind to the W.S.W. under double reefed main topsail saw fishbacks & jumping saw. Middle part strong squalls with light showers of rain at daylight made sail. Leather steered N.E. by E. employed mending sails got at 11 A.M. Obs. & made the sextant 15 miles to the westward of the Chios so ends. Lat 21.57 Long by Chron 111.25

Remarks Board Wednesday June 28th

Attends with strong gales from S.E. accompanied with light squalls of rain steering N.E. by E. at 6 P.M. shortened for the night. Middle part lighter at daylight set away by reef topsails jib & spanker. Leather part blowing heavy with squalls of rain employed bracing & headed W. & so ends. Lat 20.41 Long by Chron 111.27 E

Remarks Board Thursday June 29th 1839

First part fresh gales with passing from S.E. steering E. by N. at 6 P.M. double reefed the topsails. Middle part the same. Leather no material alteration got Linn. Obs. & made the sextant 10 miles to westward of Chios so goes. This day saw nothing try times. Lat 20.01 S Long by Chron 114.14 E

Remarks Board Friday June 30th 1839

Commences with fresh gales from S.E. steering by the wind to the East under double reefed topsails jib & spanker weather clear. Middle part clear but very strong winds at 6 P.M. took ship 122 fath to the East again at daylight on green water saw humpbacks. Leather part fair whale weather set the main sail heading N.E. by E. water rather darker got Linn. Obs. & made the sextant 10 miles to westward of Chios employed repairing old sails. Lat 19.26 S Long by Chron 114.51 E

Ship Young Phoenix Indian Ocean

Remarks on Board Saturday July 1st 1839

Commences with moderate breezes & fine weather wind S.E. steering N.E. water darker colored at 6 P.M. fixed the main sail employed mending sails. Middle part light breezes & clear weather standing to the W. & E. latter part the same painting the rails saw nothing dull time & trying hard. Lat 18.48 S Long by Chron 115.45 E

Remarks on Board Sunday July 2nd 1839

Slight breezes & clear weather standing to the W. saw nothing at 6 P.M. took ship to the south. Middle part very light air & calm. Leather part steering S.E. wind from S.S.W. very light passing clouds saw nothing dull time so goes this 24 hours. Lat 18.19 S Long by Chron 116.14 E

Remarks on Board Monday July 3rd 1839

Attends with light breezes & clear fine weather wind from S.W. steering to the S.E. with all sail out. Middle part whale watches carrying all sail wind from the westward & equally at 12 o'clock took in top galant sails. Leather part light breezes & overcast wind from the south steering S.W. saw nothing so goes this 24 hours. Lat 18.48 S Long by Chron 115.56 E

Remarks on Board Tuesday July 4th

First part light breezes & overcast weather steering to the S.W. wind from S.E. at 4 P.M. saw 2 large whales yawning to the N.E. lowered the boats & got up to one & mist him fore & alog chase till dark & came on board & took in sail double reefed. Middle part strong breezes & clear. Leather part the same steering to East wind from the S.E. employed an sundry jobs about the rigging so goes this day dull time for the 24 July. Lat 18.48 S Long by Chron 116.32 E
