Remarks on Board Monday September 18th
This day fine weather employed striking bread & shock
heads out of the lightest stowing it down so ends

Remarks on Board Tuesday September 19th
This weather good all Hands employed clearing the
Big Haulk at 3 P.M. hauled off from the Haulk the
mooring employed stowing oil & bread &c so ends

Remarks on Board Wednesday 20 Sept
This day boisterous with light squalls of rain employed
stowing oil provision Bread shock heads &c so goes

Thursday September 21st 1837
First part attended with fresh trades & pleasant weather
all hands employed stowing provision & Bread shock
heads &c at 1 P.M. hung the rudder so ends

Remarks on Board Friday September 22nd
Fresh trade & pleasant weather all hands employed stowing
provision & oil so ends

Remarks on Board Saturday 23 Sept
Strong squalls from Eastward with light showers of
rain all hands employed stowing Bread & oil cash so goes

Remarks on Board Sunday 24 Sept
Attended with a moderate & good weather all Hands on
Liberty and so ends

Remarks on Board Monday 25 September
Squally with light showers had 6 men from the
Florida Latter Baking & coopering oil to go on shore
Latter part the same all business employed on
Sunday so goes this 24 hours

Ship Young Phoenix in Port Lewis 29 1837

Remarks on Board Tuesday 26 September
Strong squalls from Eastward employed Baking out &
Coopering oil to send ashore to defray the ship expenses
Latter employed the same so ends

Remarks on Board Wednesday 27 September
Fresh trade weather variable employed coopering oil &
stowing it in lighters at 11 o'clock some of the liberty men
coming of to the ship in a canoe the canoe capsized &
Nesail White the cook was drowned at 7 A.M. found the
Body & buried the corpse inquest over it & at 3 o'clock it was
interred in the grave yard at Port Lewis so ends

Remarks on Board Thursday September 28
This 24 hours commenced with fresh trades & pleasant
weather all hands employed stowing cash for water
at 9 A.M. landed 21 casks of sperm oil at 11 landed 24
casks of sperm oil Latter all Hands employed Baking
out oil & putting it in lighters at 4 P.M. landed
13 casks of sperm so ends

Remarks on Board Friday September 29
Attended with good weather at 6 A.M. landed 6 casks of sperm
oil being in all 64 casks containing in all 318 lbs Latter
Port employed rafting water casks so goes

Remarks on Board Saturday September 30
Commenced with good weather all Hands employed
getting of water got off 250 barrels & employed stowing
it down so ends

Remarks on Board Sunday October 1st
Pleasant weather all Hands on liberty the Bethiel
on Board the Charles Whitley to day but few attended
so goes this blessed Lords day
