Remarks on Board Monday October 2nd

This day fine weather all Hands employed rafting with ashore
& getting of water & stowing the Co. so ends

Remarks on Board Tuesday October 3rd

Commences with a strong trade & fine weather all Hands
Employed stowing water casks the Latter part
setting up rigging so goes this day

Remarks on Board Wednesday Oct 4th

First part all Hands employed setting up rigging the
Latter part sending up top sail yards. Cooper setting
up shooks so ends

Remarks on Board Thursday Oct 5th

Attends with light showers of rain all Hands employed
Landing T. G. mast & yards & royal mast fly jib boom
so the so ends

Remarks on Board Friday Oct 6th

Clear pleasant weather all Hands employed setting
up the rigging fore & aft & putting things to sites
so goes this day

Remarks on Board Saturday Oct 7th

Fresh breeze with light showers of rain all
Hands employed in the rigging so ends

Remarks on Board Sunday Oct 8th

A strong trade & good weather all Hands in busy
so ends

Remarks on Board Monday Oct 9th

Gentle breeze & good weather all Hands employed
in sundry jobs about rigging & bending sails getting
ready for sea as fast as possible so goes this day
so ends

Ship Young Phoenix off the Island of Mauritius

Remarks on Board Sunday Oct 22nd

These twenty four hours commences with light winds &
Clear weather at 2 P.M. commenced cutting at 4 finished cutting
the two whales Middle part strong wind at 2 A.M. resists
the topsails at 3 A.M. took in shore strong winds from the
East at 11 A.M. of the Bell being the oughter roads of Port Louis
for the reserved season all Hands employed cutting &
trying out Blubber

Remarks on Board Monday 23 October

First part a fine trade from E.S.E. with pleasant weather
Standing off & on Port Louis at 6 P.M. the Police came
off with the 3 deserters at 7 put away at 10 for Madagascar
Middle & Latter parts of the day moderate breeze clear
weather stowing so ends

Remarks on Board Tuesday 24 October

Commences with a brisk trade & clear weather stowing
the 16 at 4 P.M. finish hoisting the whales Middle part
stowed West by compass Latter part at 5 till 8 the light
showers of rain the Island of Bourbon in sight about 80 miles
Distance all sail out steering West by compass the watch
Employed washing off & cleaning the pots & Co. so ends
Left 20.40

Remarks on Board Wednesday 25 October

First part moderate breeze & fine weather steering
West by compass with all sail set the Cooper employed
repairing casks the watch employed getting some new cutting
eyes & other small jobs in the whaling line Middle
part very light airs from E.S.E. Latter part the same with
clear employed coopersing the oil so ends Left 21.53 Long 68.48 E.

Remarks on Board Thursday October 26 1837

Commences with light airs & calms with a smooth sea steering
West employed setting the oil down in blubber room Middle part
calms Latter part light airs the watch employed tarring & mending
garns & Co. so ends Left 21.15 Long 68.57 East
