

Ship Young Phoenix of New Bedford 1837

Remarks on Board Saturday November 4th

This 24 hours commences with breezes from West & fine weather steering North by compass at 2 P.M. got Obs by 60° 15' the sextant 15 miles to the West of the Chero. all employed setting up shrouds saw Blackfish & Porpoises. Middle part weather the same Latter part steered N.E. with light holling airs at meridian saw the Land abundance of Blackfish & Porpoises so goes this day. Lat 24° 54' Long 43° 30'

Remarks on Board Sunday November 5th 1837

Commences with light breezes & pleasant from West steering N.E. by compass with all sail out employed setting up Shrouds &c. at 2 P.M. got a Line Distance & made the Sextant 20 miles to West of the Chero. & the Chero. agreeing with the Land. Saw Humpbacks & Blackfish & Porpoises in abundance. Middle part very light airs working to the N. Latter part got a breeze from N.W. by N. at 4 A.M. took of shore so goes this 24 hours. Lat 24° 00' S Long by Chero. 43° 48' E

Remarks on Board Monday November 6th 1837

this day fine weather at 1 P.M. took in shore wind from S.W. by N. at 4 P.M. bent the Chains at 6 P.M. of the reef of Sandy Islands in 8 fathoms of water had a heavy squall from S.W. double reefed the topsails & hauled of shore & fired the main sail thick & squally. Middle part the same Latter part at 6 A.M. found that we had to Leeward of the harbor made all sail that we could carry & got to the windward at meridian 8 miles to the of the Harbor so goes.

Remarks on Board Tuesday November 7th

Attends with a strong breeze from South beating up for the Harbor at 3 P.M. let go the Anchor in 10 fathoms water & paid out 20 fathoms of chain & the man in the channel couldn't get bottom with 20 fathoms of Line and took the Anchor of the back & was obliged to make sail & stung of at 10 and at 11 & made day on & took the Anchor & made sail headed up. Lat. at 5 P.M. took of shore at 11 of west main water hall

Remarks on Board Wednesday Nov 8th

This 24 hours commences with strong breeze from S.W. beating up to the Harbor at 2 P.M. came to in 7 fathoms of water in Augustine Bay found a French man of war. In fire the sails & leaved up & set the watch the wind at night moderated. Middle part a light breeze of shore. Latter part a land breeze & fine had the head prince of & got permit to get wood & water so goes this day.

Remarks on Board Thursday Nov 9th 1837

First part fine weather a strong sea breeze set in got of one Bulluck & got the boats ready for wooding. Middle part wind of shore at 3 A.M. call all hands & sent them boats of after wood. Latter part a light breeze of shore & fine weather so ends this day.

Remarks on Board Friday November 10th

Attends with fine weather with the regular land & sea breezes all hands employed wooding. Middle part light wind of shore at 4 A.M. call all hands & sent 2 boats wooding at 8 A.M. the boats return with 2 loads. Latter part weather the same so ends.

Remarks on Board Saturday Nov 11th

Commences with fine weather with regular land & sea breezes employed wooding. Middle part fine weather. Latter part the same with regular Land & sea breezes got of 3 Boat loads of wood employed stowing it away so ends.

Remarks on Board Sunday Nov 12

Attends with fine weather the regular wind employed stowing down wood. Middle part weather the same. Latter part no alteration the French man of war sail for Bourbon and boats crew a shore on liberty so goes this day & no fish but a plenty of Blackskine.
