Remarks on Board Wednesday March 9th 1838

This twenty four hours commences with light baffling air from South
Heads to the westward Middle part calm Latter a light air from
South heading to the West employed painting the ship in side as
Ends this day is no fish dull times

Lat 11.30 Long 111.22

Remarks on Board Thursday March 10th

Commences with calm Middle the same Latter part a light
Breeze from South steering to the N. W. so ends employed painting

Lat 11.33 Long 111.26

Remarks on Board Friday March 11th 1838

Attends with a calm Middle part the same Latter part no
variation so ends this day a profound Calm Lat 11.33 Long 111.19 E

Remarks on Board Saturday March 12th

First part commences with a light air from N. W. steering S. W.
Saw Blackfish employed painting Middle part a light breeze from
North Latter part the same saw finbacks so ends Lat 11.57 Long 111.2

Remarks on Board Sunday March 13th

Commences with light air & calm Heads to the South Middle part
A calm Latter part got a light air from N. W. so goes
So ends this day dry time

Lat 12.11 Long 111.14 E

Remarks on Board Monday March 14th

This day attends with a light breeze from N. W. steering
South with all sail out Middle part a fine breeze from
N. W. steering to the S. E. Latter part the same employed
Making rope so ends

Lat 13.22 Long 112.04

Remarks on Board Tuesday March 15th 1838

Commences with a fine breeze & good weather steering S. E. wind
from S. E. W. Middle part strong breeze from South steering
S. E. Latter much the same at 11 A. M. saw a large whale
going quick to the North lowered the boats in pursuit of
the whale so ends this day

Remarks on Board Wednesday March 14th

This day attends with fine breeze & fine weather in chase of
the whale at 4 P. M. struck him at 5 took him to the ship
8 took in sail & set 4 watches Middle part fine wind very light
at daylight call all hands got breakfast & took on at 11 A. M. got his
Head & 8 Boddy in & went to dinner so ends Lat 13.20 Long 113.17

Remarks on Board Thursday March 15th 1838

Commences with a moderate breeze from S. E. and fine weather
at 5 P. M. finish baiting the case & made sail Heads S. W.
Set the works again Middle part the same Latter
Part fine all sail out standing to the N. W. so ends

Lat 13.50 Long 112.33 E

Remarks on Board Friday March 16th

This day attends with fine weather standing to the N. W.
With all drawing sail set employed boiling at 5 P. M.
Saw a dead whale Middle part with the same
Latter part fine standing to the westward so ends this day

Lat 14.11 Long by Chron 112.22

Remarks on Board Saturday March 17th

Attends with a fine breeze from South with fine weather
standing to the west at 3 P. M. back ship to the S. E.
Middle part at 4 P. M. finish boiling Latter part a light breeze
from S. W. steering S. E. so ends

Lat 14.12 Long by Chron 112.33

Remarks on Board Sunday March 18th

Commences with a moderate breeze from S. E. W. steering
S. E. Middle part the same Latter part strong breezes from
S. W. Heads up S. E. so ends

Lat 15.37 Long by Chron 113.44

Remarks on Board Monday March 19th

This twenty four hours commences with fresh breezes from
S. E. W. steering to the S. E. Middle part the same Latter part
having strong tack in topgallant sails employed setting up
S. E. both stays so ends
