

Ship Young Phoenix of New Bedford 1838

Remarks on Board Tuesday April the 10th 1837

This day commences with fine weather a fine breeze from S. E. steaming from Cape Cod at 2 P.M. Pass the Cape Channel in S. E. by E. with a very light breeze at 3 a calm at 4 pass 4 took the sea breeze strong stood up the bay at 7 let go the anchor in 10 fathoms of water for the night Middle part fine weather Latter weather the same at 7 A.M. lowered about 18 pulled in to the tub & got the hawing of the ship at meridian returned & got the ship under way so ends

Remarks on Board Wednesday the 11

Commenced with a moderate breeze from E. S. E. hauled up the bay at 9 P.M. let go the anchor in 4 fathoms of water & found the same Middle part fine Latter the same got a few potatoes &c. &c. so ends

Remarks on Board Thursday April 12th

This day fine weather got the sick ones hale & set spinnel Part & Latter part the same fishing & gunning so ends

Remarks on Board Friday April 13th

Throughout this twenty four hours squally weather nothing a doing men on liberty so goes these twenty four hours

Remarks on Board Friday April 14th

Throughout this twenty four hours fine weather men on liberty so ends this 24 hours

Remarks on Board Sunday April 15

Throughout this twenty four hours moderate breeze from N. W. with overcast weather with squalls of rain so ends

Remarks on Board Monday April 16th

This 24 hours attends with strong winds from S. E. with light squalls of rain at 1 P.M. one boat started for Lasenhalt at 6 P.M. the Samuel Wright arrive hailing 1800 lbs. so sprim so goes this 24 hours

Remarks on Board Tuesday April 17 1837

Throughout this 24 hours strong breeze from S. E. with clear weather employed breaking out for corn to land ashore so ends this 24 hours

Remarks on Board Wednesday April 18th 1837

Throughout this day light variable winds & clear weather so goes this 24 hours

Remarks on Board Thursday April 19th 1837

This 24 hours commences with light westerly winds & clear weather Middle part cloudy Latter part of the day strong winds & squally S. W. the Ship Samuel Wright Anchor in the lower part of the Bay so goes this 24 hours

Remarks on Board Friday April 20th

Light westerly winds & clear weather Middle part cloudy Latter part light variable winds & clear weather at 5 P.M. the boat returned from Port Leuchinault so ends

Remarks on Board Saturday April 21st

All of these 24 hours light variable winds clear weather so goes this day is part of the crew on liberty

Remarks on Board Sunday April 22nd

Throughout this twenty four hours light variable winds & clear weather Middle part the same Latter light airs and variables so ends

Remarks on Board Monday April 23rd

Commences with light S. E. clear weather Middle and Latter Part light winds cloudy so ends this 24 hours

Remarks on Board Tuesday April 24 1838

First of this twenty four hours light winds & cloudy Middle Part calm Latter part light S. E. winds clear weather employed Blacking the bands so ends this 24 hours
