

Ship Young Phoenix West Coast of N. H. 1838

Remarks on Board Thursday May 17th 1838

This twenty four hours strong breezes from N. E. standing to the East employed steering the deck Middle part under double reefed main topsail & fore sail set the works againing Latter Part set double reefed topsails & jib standing to the S. E. saw nothing employed Boiling so ends Lat 28.35 Long 110.30

Remarks on Board Friday May 18th 1838

This day strong breezes from N. E. standing to the S. E. Middle main topsail & fore sail Latter part made all sail standing to the S. E. fine weather saw finback so ends

Lat 28.41 Long 110.44 East

Remarks on Board Saturday May 19th

This fine weather wind S. E. standing to the S. E. & P. M. under double reefed main topsail & fore sail headed to the W. S. E. Latter part strong breezes from S. E. with squally of rain so ends Lat 29.59 Long 109.15 E

Remarks on Board Sunday May 20th

First part of this twenty four hours commences with strong breezes from S. E. standing to the S. E. under double reefed topsails Middle part under close reefed main topsails Latter part all sail out standing to the S. E. saw nothing so ends this day Lat 29.47 Long 109.12 East

Remarks on Board Monday May 21st

Commences with strong breezes from S. E. with overcast weather steering N. E. with all sail out Middle part under double reefed main topsail Latter part set single reefed topsails standing to the N. E. employed coopersing the oil so ends this day Lat 28.36 Long 109.37 E

Remarks on Board Tuesday May 22nd 1838

Commences with strong breezes from S. E. steering N. E. setting the bed down in Chubbier rain Middle part the same Latter made all sail standing to the N. E. saw nothing employed mending the main topsail so ends Lat 28.01 S Long 110.38 E

Remarks on Board Wednesday May 23rd

These twenty four hours commences with light breezes from East standing to the N. E. with all sail out at sunset shorten sail for the night Middle part weather the same Latter made all sail standing to the S. E. saw nothing so ends Lat 28.41 Long 110.45

Remarks on Board Thursday May 24th

This twenty four hours attends with strong breezes from S. E. steering S. E. at sunset shorten sail for the night Middle part fair weather Latter made all sail standing to the S. E. saw nothing so ends this day Lat 29.02 Long 111.15

Remarks on Board Friday May 25th 1838

This day attends with good weather wind from Eastward steering S. E. with all sail out employed mending sail at sunset shorten sail for the night headed to the West Latter part all sail out light airs from the North steering to the West saw finbacks Lat 29.18 Long 111.23

Remarks on Board Saturday May 26

These twenty four hours light airs from North with fine weather saw the whale dead that was fasted for 15th of month Middle part calmed Latter part the dead whale about 3 miles of towed 3 boats to towed him to the ship at 10 A. M. took on at Meridian got the body in 8 Head of so ends this day Lat 29.40 Long 111.00

Remarks on Board Sunday May 27

These twenty four hours light baffling birds & calmed took the dead in employed mending it up & clearing the decks Middle part boiling Latter part light airs from East standing to the N. E. with all sail out at 10 A. M. finished Boiling & wash of saw nothing but finback the whale made 30 lbs & we cut him in the 15 day from the time we struck so ends this 24 hours Lat 29.43 S Long 109.21 E
