Remarks on Board Wednesday June 20th

These twenty four Hours commences with a light breeze from E. & S. Steering N. E. by E. with all sail out weather fine Middle part fine Latter part the same standing to the N. E. with all sail out so ends this 24 hours. Lat 26.12 Long 110.19.

Remarks on Board Thursday June 21st 1838

First part of these twenty four Hours commences with light breeze from E. & S. Steering N. E. fine weather at 2 P. M. Saw whales lowered 3 boats but got nothing Middle strong breezes Latter Part the same steering to the N. E. so goes this 24 hours Lat 25.48 Long 110.42

Remarks on Board Friday June 22nd 1838

This day commences with fresh breezes from East steering N. E. Saw finbacks under whole topsails and fore Middle part fine Latter part strong breeze from North steered East saw finbacks so ends Lat 24.52 Long 110.00

Remarks on Board Saturday June 23rd 1838

This twenty four Hours commences with a fine breeze from North with clear weather steering East to South with all sail out Middle Part at 2 A. M. sounded 70 fathoms stood in heel and hauled a back at 5 A. M. capt of at 7 A. M. saw the land at 10 A. M. found it to be Donna Island steered for the channel at the junction of the point running to the South at 10 got an altitude and made Chres to agree with the Land

Remarks on Board Sunday June 24th 1838

First part attends with fine weather wind from N. N. W. and clear at 2 P. M. got 11 fathoms of the point hauled up along shore at 4 P. M. came to in 4 fathoms of water 7 miles from the South point of Donna Isl. and 3 miles from the shore Middle part fine Latter at daylight sent 3 boat turtle and fish got a plenty of fish but no turtle fine weather wind from East so end this day in Shanks Bay

Remarks on Board Monday June 25th

First part fine with a light air from S. E. at 3 P. M. one boat return with 36 Doz. of Shags Middle part calm Latter part a light breeze from S. E. boats of fishing caught a abundance of fish the pogies or scups a fine fish saw great numbers of shark both young and old but a very few turtle great numbers of Shags or commerrants so ends this twenty four Hours

New-Holland from New Bedford 1838

Remarks on Board Tuesday June 26th

This twenty four Hours commences with a calm Middle Part a profound calm at daylight call all hands and shove up the anchor and stood out of the bay with a light from breezes from N. W. at 10 A. M. cut chine of the Heads straining to the N. E. with all sail out employed stowing the Anchors and chains &c so ends Lat 25.20 Long 112.28

Remarks on Board Wednesday June 27th 1838

This twenty four Hours commences with a fresh breeze from the N. W. standing to the S. W. wind hauling to the South at 2 P. M. stood to the N. W. wind from S. W. breasting on at 4 took in the main topgalant sail at a double reefed masts looking snug Middle part blowing strong close reefed wind from South Latter part the same fished the main topsail and fore sail steered N. W. so ends Lat 25.06 Long 110.11 East

Remarks on Board Thursday June 28th 1838

First of these twenty four Hours commences with a heavy Gale from South steering N. under close reefed fore and main topsails Middle part the same Latter part set fore sail and main topsails weather moderated a little set double reefed topsail jib and spanker steered N. E. so ends this day Lat 22.49 Long 110.22

Remarks on Board Friday June 29th 1838

This day fresh breezes from S. E. with clear weather standing to the N. E. saw finbacks and cow fish Middle part light air Latter the same saw nothing so ends Lat 21.45 Long 110.47

Remarks on Board Saturday June 30th 1838

This day attends with light airs from the S. E. steering N. E. with all sail out Middle part wind from E. & S. Latter Part the same employed on gunnery jobs about the rigging so ends this day dry time no fish Lat 20.36 Long 110.08

Remarks on Board Sunday July 1st 1838

First of this twenty four Hours commences with a leading breeze from E. & S. North fine weather Middle part wind shifted headed up N. E. Latter much the same saw nothing dull times no fish beautiful weather so ends this twenty four Hours Lat 19.12 Long 110.01 East
