

Ship Young Phoenix of New Bedford

Remarks on Board Friday December 14 1838

Attends with light airs from westward standing to the S. E. boiling middle part the same. Latter light airs from S. S. E. steering to the W. S. W. so ends Lat 13.20 Long 118.10

Remarks on Board Saturday December 15th

a fine breeze from S. S. E. fine weather standing to the N. E. W. Middle part headed up South Latter light airs from South standing to the West at 10 A. M. finish boiling weather overcast so ends No Observation

Remarks on Board Sunday December 16th

Attends with light airs and overcast wind from all point of compass with frequent thunder and lightning at 1 P. M. saw a shoal of whales going quick to S. S. E. lowered the boats but could not fasten whales very shie Middle part under short sail heading to the South Latter part squally with thunder and lightning so ends Lat 13.25 Long 117.26

Remarks on Board Monday December 17th

first part a light breeze from South standing to the W. S. W. weather squally with thunder and lightning Middle part under double reefed topsails standing to the S. W. Latter part squally trying to get to the South employed cooping squalls from all points of the compass but very light so ends this day Lat 13.33 Long 117.12 East

Remarks on Board Tuesday Dec 18th

commences with squalls from all points of the compass but not heavy Middle under color reef main topsail at Latter part a light breeze from S. S. W. standing to the S. E. employed stowing down in the fore hole so ends this 24 hours Lat 13.43 Long 118.29 E

Remarks on Board Wednesday Dec 19th

employed stowing down at 5 P. M. finish Middle part light very light and boiling Latter part got a fine breeze from S. S. W. standing to the S. E. so ends Lat 13.57 Long 118.58

Remarks on Board Thursday December 20th

first part fine with a bending breeze from S. S. W. at 4 P. M. took ship to the S. W. Middle squally with heavy thunder and lightning with abundance of rain Latter part rainy wind shift so ends Lat 14.11 Long 119.11 East

Remarks on Board Friday December 21st

first part overcast with strong breeze from S. S. W. standing to the S. E. at 4 P. M. took ship to the West Middle part the same Latter rainy with strong breeze so ends this day finish Lat 14.25 South

Remarks on Board Saturday Dec 22nd

Attends with overcast weather with strong breeze from S. S. W. to the W. S. W. at sunset weather look better Middle part a light squall Latter standing to the S. W. with all sail out say nothing Lat 13.51 Long 118.00 E

Remarks on Board Sunday December 23rd

commences with moderate breeze from S. W. standing to the N. W. with all sail out Middle taken to the S. S. E. Latter part took ship to the S. W. at 10 A. M. saw a sail to the windward under short sail cutting so ends this day Lat 14.00 Long 118.00 East

Remarks on Board Monday December 24th

Attends with strong breeze from S. W. at 4 P. M. spoke the Kingdowns got 150 lbs hence we saw her Middle part under 3 topsails standing to the South Latter part saw nothing so ends Lat 14.04 Long 117.25 E

Remarks on Board Tuesday December 25th

first part light boiling air from S. S. W. standing to the N. S. W. Middle part the same Latter a calm but distant thunder so ends Lat 13.46 Long 117.22 E

Remarks on Board Wednesday Dec 26th

Attends with a calm at 2 P. M. a heavy squall from the N. E. steered S. W. double reefed Middle part light breeze from S. E. steering headed to the S. W. Latter strong breeze from South steering W. S. W. with all sail out so ends Lat 14.11 Long 116.07 E

Remarks on Board Thursday December 27th

first part strong breeze from South at 5 P. M. light again Middle light moderate Latter squally steered W. S. W. so ends Lat 14.09 Long 116.00 East

Remarks on Board Friday December 28th 1838

squally wind from S. S. E. steering W. S. W. at sunset double reefed Middle part moderate Latter steered about at 11 saw whales to the S. S. W. steered for them so ends over cast weather
