Remarks on Board Monday February 4th 1839

Steering S. E. with a light breeze from the E. Middle and Latter parts of the day light airs and calms employ'd hoisting up water from the main hatchway so goes this day. Lat 9.14 Long by Chron 114.05 E
 Tuesday 5th commences with light airs and calms Middle the same Latter part get a light breeze from S. W. steering by the starboard to the S. E. so ends Lat 9.47 Long 113.37 E
 Wednesday 6th first part of these twenty four hours attends with baffling airs from South with light squalls of rain Middle part the same Latter part no alteration dull times no wind and no fish Lat 10.01 Long by Chron 113.14
 Thursday 7th commences with baffling airs from South with light squalls of rain at 5 P. M. get a fine breeze from S. E. steering S. W. Middle part a fine breeze Latter more moderate so ends Lat 11.02 Long by Chron 111.58 E
 Friday 8th first part of these twenty four hours light breezes from S. E. steering to the S. W. saw nothing Middle part wind from South heading W. S. W. Latter come up S. W. rather smoky saw nothing so ends this day Lat 11.42 Long 110.51 E
 Saturday 9th commences with a strong breeze from S. E. steering S. W. weather hazy Middle part the same Latter part light airs with hazy weather so ends no fish Lat 12.41 Long by Chron 109.46
 Sunday 10th light breezes from S. E. fine weather steering to the S. W. Middle part strong with light squalls of rain Latter at 4 P. M. took ship to the East took in topgallant sails so ends Lat 13.18 Long by Chron 109.04
 Monday 11th strong gales from S. E. steering to East at 2 P. M. took ship to the S. W. Middle part the same Latter part no alteration headed up S. W. by S. so ends this day Lat 14.14 Long by Chron 107.57 E
 Tuesday 12th commences with fresh gales from S. E. steering to the S. W. by the wind under topsails and courses Middle part the same Latter part strong and heavy smothery headed up S. W. by S. so goes this day Lat 15.40 South
 Long by Chron 106.40 East

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Remarks on Board February Wednesday 18th

Commences with strong gales fresh S. E. with smothery weather steering to the S. W. beat the new maintop sail Middle part the same Latter set the maintop gale aboard headed up S. S. W. so ends Lat 15.54 Long 105.57 East
 Thursday 14th attends with strong gales from S. E. steering to the S. Westward employ'd repairing the main top sail Middle part the same Latter very smothery wind as usual so ends Lat 18.15 S Long by Chron 104.44 E
 Friday 15th commences with strong breezes and smothery weather steering to the S. S. W. employ'd repairing sails Middle and Latter parts the same weather smothery so ends Lat 20.05 Long by Chron 103.53 E
 Saturday 16th commences with strong breezes and hazy weather steering to the S. S. W. at 4 P. M. took ship headed up E. S. E. Middle and Latter parts the same so ends Lat 19.45 S Long by Chron 104.56 E
 Sunday 17th first part fresh gales from S. E. steering to the S. E. employ'd mending sails Middle under single reefed topsails Latter part the same come up E. by S. so ends Lat 19.10 South Long by Chron 106.29 East
 Monday 18th commences with strong breezes from S. S. E. steering East Middle part light airs Latter part light breezes from S. S. W. headed up S. E. saw nothing so ends this day Lat 19.17 Long by Chron 108.13 East
 Tuesday 19th attends with moderate breezes from S. S. W. steering to the S. E. at 5 P. M. spoke the ship Euclides of Greenwich 4 months out bound to Canton sent a boat on board and got some medicines Middle part the same Latter part light airs and hazy weather steering to the S. E. so ends this day Lat 20.09 Long by Chron 109.44 East
 Wednesday 20th commences with light airs from S. S. E. steering S. S. E. Middle part the same Latter no alteration so ends Lat 20.38 Long by Chron 109.55 East
 Thursday 21th commences with light breezes and fine weather wind from S. S. W. Middle part the same Latter part a strong breeze from South headed up E. S. E. so goes this day Lat 21.01 East Long by Chron 110.05 East
