

Remarks on Board Ship Young Thorne
 Friday 22nd Commences with fresh gales from East
 headed up E.S.E. Middle part commeth S.E. Latter part
 at daylight saw a sail at 3 o'clock spoke the Albion of
 Funchaven 7 months out with 1500 bbls of Whale oil so ends
 this day Lat 22.34 Long by Chron 112.16 East
 Saturday 23rd attends with strong breezes from S.E.
 steering to the S.E. in company with the Albion of Funchaven
 Middle part stood by the West Latter part blowing
 heavy from South under double reefed topsails so gase
 this day Lat 23.16 Long by Chron 112.10 East
 Sunday 24th commences with strong gales from
 South standing to the Westward under double reefed
 topsail Middle main topsail and fore sail Latter
 part the same at Meridian veered ship Lat 23.30 Long 111.25
 Monday 25th commences with a strong gale from S.E.
 standing to the East close Main topsail and fore sail
 Middle and Latter parts the same employed repairing
 a boat at 8 o'clock veered ship to the W. blowing fresh
 so ends Lat 23.32 South Long by Chron 112.10 E
 Tuesday 26th first part blowing heavy from South
 standing to the W.S.W. under double reefed topsails
 Middle field fore and main topsails Latter
 the same blowing heavy Lat 23.31 Long 111.03 East
 Wednesday 27th commences a heavy gale from South
 headed to the W.S.W. under 2 close reefed topsails
 Middle blowing heavy took in fore topsail Latter
 part more moderate set the fore topsail again
 so gase this day Lat 23.33 Long by Chron 110.08
 Thursday 28th commences with heavy gales from S.E.
 headed to the S.W. under 2 close reefed topsails employed
 mending the old boat Middle part and Latter parts
 weather the same so ends Lat 23.29 Long by Chron 109.10
 Friday 29th commences with a heavy gale and wetting
 thick weather under 2 close reefed topsails at 4 P.M.
 veered ship to the East Middle part a heavy gale becoming
 fell down to 23 inches so hundredths Latter continued in to S.W. and
 moderate the Barometer rising but a very heavy swell
 from South so ends Lat 23.27 Long by Chron 109.00 E.

 Saturday 2nd Commences with strong breezes from S.W.
 with overcast weather under close reefed main topsail
 and fore sail Middle very light air Latter a
 light breeze from W.S.W. steering South the Barometer
 29.00 at 24 inches and so hundredths so ends
 this day Lat 23.40 Long by Chron 109.29
 Sunday 3rd attends with light breezes from West
 steering South with all sail out Middle part
 the same Latter fine at 8 o'clock saw the Albion of
 Funchaven cutting so gear this day Lat 24.22 Long 109.38
 Monday 4th commences with fine weather a light
 breeze from S.W. at 1 P.M. saw the ship beginning
 after 10 o'clock took ship at 2 P.M. saw the whale and
 boats lowered 2 boats at 4 o'clock others 2 boats lowered
 at 4 P.M. the Albion boat struck the whale and
 kill him Middle part weather the same Latter part
 fresh breezes from S.E. saw grampases and Black
 fish so ends Lat 24.35 Long by Chron 109.29 E
 Tuesday 5th commences with strong breezes from
 S.E. standing to the S.W. Middle part double
 reefed Latter part blowing strong saw nothing
 so ends Lat 24.27 Long by Chron 109.13 E
 Wednesday 6th commences strong wind from
 S.E. standing to the East Middle part the same
 Latter standing to the S.W. so ends Lat 24.20 Long 108
 Thursday 7th commences with strong winds as usual
 Middle and Latter parts weather the same saw nothing
 so ends Long 109.42 East Lat 24.12 South
 Friday 8th commences with strong southerly winds
 and breezy weather Middle the same Latter
 saw breaches to windward took for them so ends
 Lat 24.32 Long 110.18 E
 Saturday 9th commences with strong winds from
 South steering West at 1 P.M. saw a whale report
 lowered the boats whale going South at 3 P.M. struck
 a large whale stove 2 boats lost one all together at 8
 P.M. cut from the whale spouting blood Middle part
 the same Latter took up and huff took up for the boat
 and whale but saw nothing Lat 24.10 Long 109.57 East
