 Mermark on board Monday April 15th 1839
 Commences with strong gales from S.E. employed stowing down
 Middle and Latter parts fair whale weather employed stowing
 down so ends Lat 29.18 Long 141.10
 Tuesday 16th attends with fine weather Middle part
 the same Latter part made sail double reefed to sails
 standing to the S.E. so ends Lat 29.08 Long 141.30
 Wednesday 17th commences with light breezes from
 South with overcast weather standing to the East employed
 stowing down Middle part light squalls of rain Latter
 part again employed stowing Lat 28.45 Long 141.53
 Thursday 18th commences with moderate breezes from
 South standing to the East at 6 P.M. finish stowing
 down Middle part light airs from S. Latter part fine
 weather saw black fish so ends Lat 28.55 Long 141.50
 Friday 19th commences with fresh breezes from South
 standing to the S.E. with all sail out at 4 P.M. squally
 took in top galant sail a boy fell from the main top galant
 and yard finding the main top galant sail struck in the
 water about 10 feet from the lee quarter lowered a boat and
 picked him up unharmed Middle part under double reefed
 topsails Latter part blowing strong took in fore and main
 topsails so ends Lat 29.10 Long 140.30 East
 Saturday 20th commences with strong breezes from S.W.
 standing to the West under double reefed topsails Middle
 and Latter parts fine weather standing to S.E. saw nothing
 employed setting up shooks so ends Lat 28.53 Long 140.25
 Sunday 21st commences with light breezes from South
 with hazy weather standing to the S.E. with all sail out
 Middle double reefed Latter made sail headed up south
 fine weather saw nothing so ends Lat 29.46 Long 140.40 East
 Monday 22nd commences with good weather standing to the
 South Middle part double reefed Latter part made
 all sail standing to the North Lat 30.12 Long 141.07 E
 Tuesday 23rd commences light breezes from W. with hazy
 weather with light squalls of rain standing to the North
 at 2 saw a shoal of whales at 3 P.M. lowered the boat
 struck and got to a large whale and cow at 11 P.M.

 Tuesday continued got them to the ship a large
 body of whales a gawing South Middle the watches
 getting ready for cutting at day light took on
 strong breezes at 10 got the large whale head of and 2 blank
 pieces and fore of sunb parted the puke and sunk
 lost most of the body so ends Lat 30.00 Long 141.25
 Wednesday 24th weather the same strong cutting
 the small whale and took in the large whale head
 Middle part cleaning the jaws and head Latter part
 boiling weather moderate made sail stood to the N.W.
 so ends Lat 30.03 No Longitude this day
 Thursday 25th moderate breezes with overcast weather
 standing to the N.W. Middle part the same Latter part
 fine weather so ends Lat 29.12 Long 141.02 East
 Friday 26th fine weather wind fresh West standing
 to the North employed boiling out 4 P.M. took ship
 to the N.W. Middle part weather Latter part the
 same standing to the N.W. Lat 29.03 Long 141.20 East
 Saturday 27th light breezes from S.W. standing to the
 N.W. with all sail out Middle part weather fine
 Latter part a calm so ends Lat 28.55 Long 140.57
 Sunday 28th commences with calm Middle part
 Middle and Latter parts much the same very
 light baffling airs so ends Lat 29.10 Long 140.34
 Monday 29th commences with light breeze from
 the westward standing to the South Middle
 part a light airs from S.E. Latter part the same
 South so ends Lat 30.11 Long 140.46
 Tuesday 30th commences with light breeze from S.E.
 with overcast weather steering S.E. Middle double
 reefed headed up S.E. at 12 o'clock moved ship to the
 N.W. Latter part spoke the carcass of Fairhaven
 6 months with 1300 barrel of oil 120 sperm found
 in to the bays so ends No Observations
 Wednesday May 1st commences with strong
 gales from S.W. heading to the south under double
 reefed main topsail and fore sail Latter part steering
 S.E. with all drawing sail set Lat 30.00 Long 140.30 E
