Thursday May 2nd Commenced with light breezes from S.W. steering N.E. Middle shorten sail for the night Latter part made sail steered N.W. fine weather wind from S.W. saw nothing so ends Lat 30.45 Long 111.24 E.
 Friday 3rd Commenced with a fresh breeze from S.W. steering N.W. at 6 P.M. shorten sail for the night Latter part made sail to the N. so ends Lat 30.11 Long 110.50
 Saturday 4th Commenced with strong winds from E.S.E. steering S. at 5 P.M. shorten sail for the night. Heeded to the S. S.W. Middle blowing strong Latter the same standing to the North so ends Lat 30.13 Long 110.31
 Sunday 5th Commenced with strong breezes from E.S.E. steering to the N. Middle under a main topsail Latter set double reefed topsail all appearance of a S.W. gale the Berometer falling standing to the N. wind E.S.E. but canting to West so ends Lat 29.55 Long 109.49 E.
 Monday 6th Commenced a heavy rain N.W. took fore and main topsails and fore sail at 3 P.M. rainy with heavy squalls close reefed main topsails and took the boat on upper crains at 4 P.M. canten in to S.W. the Berometer rising Middle part moderate Latter made sail steered N.W. saw nothing so ends Lat 29.58 South Long by Chron 109.25 E.
 Tuesday 7th Commenced with moderate breezes from South steering to the Westward Middle under a main topsail Latter part made sail steered North so ends overcast in weather saw nothing No Observation sun obscured
 Wednesday 8th Commenced with moderate breezes from E.S.E. with overcast weather standing to the N.E. Middle under a main topsail Latter part made sail standing to the N.E. at 7 P.M. saw whales run for the at 8 P.M. lowered the boat 4 large whales going to the N.W. at 10 p.m. 9 P.M. struck a large whale kill him at meridian took him to the ship so ends Lat 28.41 S Long Chron 109.30
 Thursday 9th Took on at sunset got the body in Middle part weather fine Latter took on to the head at Meridian finish made sail standing to the south commence boiling so ends Lat 28.27 S Long 109.55 E.

 Friday 10th Commenced with light breezes from N.W. standing to the south under double reefed topsails saw a sail to the Leeward Middle part wind haul in to south blowed strong 10 P.M. took in fore and main topsails at 11 spoke the George Washington of New Bedford 5 months out with 200 barrels of spirit Cal Latter part standing to the N.E. in company with the G. Washington so ends Lat 28.36 Long by Chron 110.13
 Saturday 11th Commenced with strong breezes from South standing to the N.E. at 5 P.M. by the wind Middle part headed up N.W. Latter made sail steered to N.E. in company with the G. Washington saw a sail to the South Lat 28.16 S Long 110.10 E.
 Sunday 12th Commenced with strong winds from N.E. steering N.E. at 5 shorten lay under a double reefed main topsail Latter part made sail steered N.E. so ends Lat 28.13 Long 110.55 E.
 Monday 13th Commenced with strong wind from South steering N.E. Middle under close reefed main topsail and fore sail stood to the N.E. Latter part strong employed cooping standing to the East under double reefed so ends Lat 26.51 Long by Chron 110.50
 Tuesday 14th Commenced with strong wind from South standing to the East Middle part under main topsail and fore sail headed to the N.W. Latter part scared ship to the N.E. employed stowing down so ends say nothing Lat 27.15 South
 Wednesday 15th Commenced with light breezes from E.S.E. standing to the N.E. at 5 P.M. finish stowing the oil Middle part headed to the N.E. Latter made sail steered to the E.S.E. fine weather saw nothing so ends Lat 27.20 Long 111.15 East
 Thursday 16th Commenced with fine weather wind from E.S.E. headed to the N.E. at sunset shorten sail for the Latter part standing to the N.E. so ends Lat 28.57 Long 111.35 East
 Friday 17th Fine weather standing to N.E. Middle under main topsail Latter part made all sail steered North strong breeze so ends Lat 25.42 S Long 111.30 East
