 Tuesday 21st commences breezy on at 2 P.M. double
 reefed at 3 P.M. the main sail wind hauling to the
 West at 4 P.M. took ship to the N. E. at 5 P.M. committed
 the corps to the deep at 6 heavy squalls from N. N. W.
 took in jib and spanker steered N. E. Middle part
 moderate Latter part made all sail steered N. E.
 fine weather so ends Lat 22.27 Long 111.38 E.
 Wednesday 22nd commences with strong breezes from S. E.
 steering N. E. with all drawing sail set at 5 P.M. spoke
 the bark Duran 8 months out with 1 right whale
 Middle part haling with light squalls of rain
 Latter part light air from East Lat 21.13 Long 111.50
 Thursday 23rd attends with a whole sail breeze from
 East headed up N. N. E. Middle part the same Latter the
 same so ends Lat 19.34 Long 112.49 East

 from East steering to the N. E. Middle and Latter
 parts the same all drawing sail set so ends this
 day Lat 18.00 Long 113.00 E.
 Saturday 25th commences with a fine whole
 sail breeze headed up N. E. Middle part the same
 Latter fine at 8 A.M. saw whales at 10 lowered
 the boats 3 large whales in site going to the N. E.
 so ends boats in pursuit Lat 15.40 Long 113.40
 Sunday 26th fine weather at 1 P.M. struck 2
 whales from one of them kill one at 4
 took him to the ship got away and took on
 at 7 P.M. headed down for the night Middle part
 weather the same at daylight took on at meridian
 got the baddy in and jink in and cogs set up saw
 a barque to windward standing to the south so ends
 this day Lat 16.31 Long 113.28 E.
 Monday 27th commences with strong breezes from
 East at 2 P.M. made sail headed up N. E.
 at 3 set work again Middle part moderate
 at daylight made all sail Latter part the same
 employed haling so ends Lat 15.19 Long 113.50 E.
 Tuesday 28th commences with moderate breezes
 from East fine clear weather Middle part and
 Latter E. headed up N. E. Latter part the same
 employed haling Lat 13.22 Long 114.55 E.
 Wednesday 29th commences with strong breezes
 East steering by the wind to the N. E. Middle
 at 6 P.M. finish haling made all sail Latter
 the same at 10 A.M. spoke the Argyle of London
 Bound to Calcutta so ends Lat 11.29 Long 115.23
 Thursday 30th commences with strong wind from
 East standing to the N. E. at 2 P.M. saw a ship
 standing to the south under short sail appeared
 to be a whaler Middle part headed up N. E.
 at daylight the S. W. of Sumatra bearing North by
 compass steered from the straits of Ablof at meridian
 anchored in Bally Roads in 13 fathoms of water and
