

Ship Young Phoenix at Pejout Harbor
Remarks on Board Friday 21st Commences with
strong sea breezes employ'd getting of wood cutting
up and stowing away got 8 boats loads at Pejout

Saturday 22nd commences with a strong sea breeze
at midnight a light land breeze employ'd getting
ready for Sea

Sunday 23rd strong trades at 4 P.M. stowed the
Larboard Anchor at 5 A.M. hove up the Anchor
and got under way with a light land breeze
at noon calms the S.E. point of Lomback bearing
S. by E. 3 Leagues distance

Monday 24th at 1 P.M. got a strong moonsoon made
2 tack and fetch out employ'd stowing chains and
Anchor at sunset the S.W. point of Lomback N.E.
Middle strong latter the same with light squalls
of rain so ends Lat 10.31 S. Long 115.50 East

Tuesday 25th commences with a strong moonsoon stand
to the S.W. at 5 P.M. spoke the Bark Coronet
Capt Bond 24 months from London gov. 160 of sperm
oil so ends saw perbeck Lat 12.03 Long 114.45

Wednesday 26th commences with a fine breeze and
fine weather standing to the S.W. with
all sail out employ'd picking over potatoes to
get rotten ones and painting the bow boat &c
so ends Lat 13.10 South Long 114.18 East

Thursday 27th first part light breeze headed up
S.E. Middle part come up S.E. with a fine
breeze latter the same employ'd repairing sails so goes
this day hours Lat 14.32 S. Long by Chron 115.00 E.

Friday 28th this day attends with a fine breeze from
N.E. headed up S.E. Middle part of South latter
the same saw nothing employ'd repairing sails so ends
Lat 16.12 Long by Chron 115.02

Saturday 29th fresh breezes from E. & S. headed up S
Middle part tack to the S.E. latter at 5 A.M. tack
to the South again saw a sail to leeward standing to the
S. saw nothing so goes this twenty four hours
Lat 16.34 S. Long by Chron 114.40 East

Ship Young Phoenix West Coast of N. Holly
Remarks on Board Sunday June 30th first part attends
with a fine breeze from East steering to the S.E. with
all sail out employ'd mending sails Middle part the
same latter part strong breezes from N.W. E.
standing to the S.E. so goes saw breeches but
nothing but jumpers Lat 17.31 Long 115.20 East

Monday July 1st fine trade from N.E. headed
to the S.E. Middle day aback at day light braced
forward at 7 A.M. saw a whale in the air rays turn
flukes at 14 p.m. & still tack for the whale at 4 still
saw him again at 4 p.m. hove up 8 boats whale
gawing to the M.S.M. at Meridian fasten stove
one boat so goes 2 sails inside Lat 18.06
Long by Chron 115.40 E.

Tuesday 2nd at 2 P.M. took the whale to the
Ship got dinner and took on a Bark and ship
in other in chase of whales at dark hove up
down for the night Middle part fine latter
at 11 A.M. finish cutting made sail and set the work
agowing so goes Lat 18.15 Long by Chron 115.25 E.

Wednesday 3rd commences with light breeze from S.E.
and clear weather at 4 P.M. spoke the Resutation
and the Marshall Bennett 4 months from London
the latter with 200 and former 1 small whale Middle
part calms latter a strong breeze from S.W. with
overcast weather headed to the S.W. employ'd boiling
so ends this day Sun Observed No Calm

Thursday 4th commences with light bofing winds and
rainy Middle part at 12 wind cantel in at South and
blowing heavy took in fore and mizen topsails latter
part the close reefed the main wear'd ship to the
East so ends Lat 17.52 S. Long by Chron 114.45

Friday 5th attends with a strong gale from South
headed to the East under close reefed main topsail
and fore sails at 1 P.M. finish boiling took in the
fore sail at 5 P.M. wear'd ship to the West Middle part
blowing heavy latter part much the same at 7 still wear'd
to the S.E. employ'd mending a boat so ends Lat 17.19 S.
